

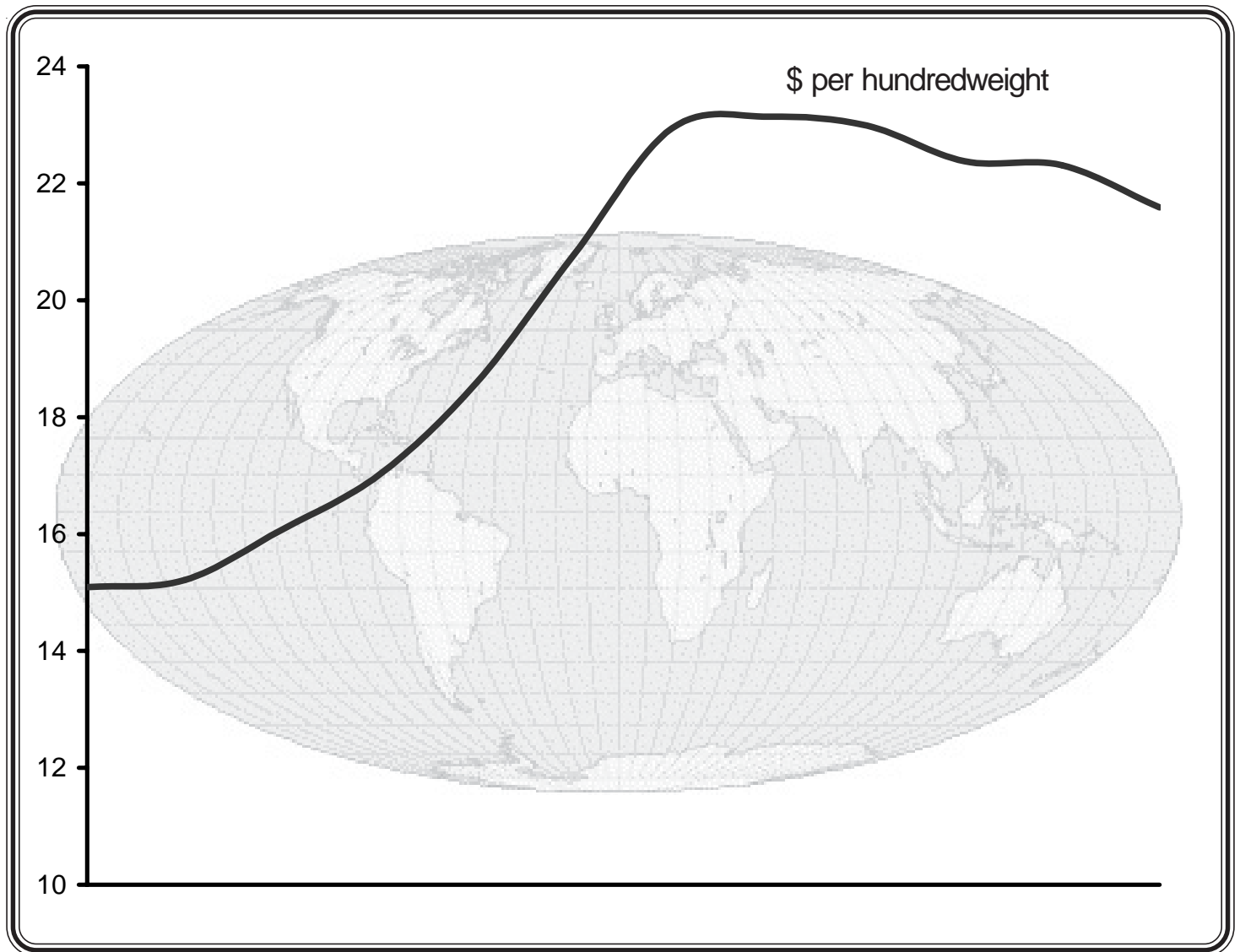
# The Market Administrator's Annual Statistical Bulletin

Northeast Milk Marketing Area  
Federal Order No. 1

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# 2007

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## Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2007 through a series of tables and charts. The *Bulletin Highlights* section summarizes important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2007. Also included are lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order with their respective locations depicted on a map of the region.

### **Prices Higher**

Higher milk prices were the big story during 2007 with producer prices and class and component prices all setting new record high annual averages for the Northeast Order. While price increases were moderate through the first five months of the year, by June the statistical uniform price at the base zone (Suffolk County, Massachusetts) exceeded 20 dollars per hundredweight and remained in excess of 20 dollars through the rest of the year. Factors behind the record prices included a relatively tight milk supply particularly during the first half of the year (following the low producer prices of 2006), higher input costs leading to modest growth in milk production, strong domestic demand, strong international demand for dairy proteins, and a weak U.S. dollar that made the exportation of U.S. dairy products particularly attractive to foreign buyers. This combination of market forces lifted milk prices to previously unforeseen levels.

For the year, all class prices averaged significantly higher than during 2006 with double digit increases in the 41 to 66 percent range. The Class I price averaged \$21.39 per hundredweight in 2007, \$6.26 above the 2006 annual average. The highest Class I price during 2007 was a record-setting \$25.16 in September. The Class II price averaged \$6.60 greater than the previous year and the Class III price rose \$6.15 from 2006. The Class IV price had the largest annual average increase with a jump of \$7.30 per hundredweight. Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston) averaged \$19.85 per hundredweight, \$6.32 (46.7 percent) higher than the 2006 price.

### **Component Prices**

The price paid to producers for butterfat averaged \$1.4693 per pound, 10.9 percent greater than in 2006. The per-pound annual average protein price rose 67.9 percent to \$3.5121. The other solids price jumped 140.6 percent from an average of \$0.1746 to \$0.4201 per pound. The average nonfat solids price increased 105.6 percent from \$0.7400 to \$1.5218 per pound. Protein, other solids, and nonfat solids all averaged record-high prices for 2007; the annual average butterfat price was the fourth highest since 2000. Even though producers are not paid directly on nonfat solids in their

milk, the value it contributes to the overall pool value is returned in the PPD.

### **Producer Milk Third Lowest on Record**

During 2007, the volume of milk received from producers shipping to handlers regulated under the Northeast Order totaled 23.0 billion pounds, an increase of 1.6 percent from 2006, but the third smallest volume since the Order's inception. The average number of producers declined 2.8 percent, while average daily deliveries per producer (DDP) increased 4.6 percent.

Total producer milk receipts began to rebound in July in response to record-setting prices that were the result of the previous year's decline in production. Nationally, milk production rose 2.1 percent in 2007; this follows increases of 2.8 percent in 2006 and 3.8 percent in 2005. National milk production was weak during the first half of 2007, but, similar to the Northeast Order, grew stronger as the year progressed. States in the Northeast trailed behind the nation, but gained momentum in the fall. In the Northeast milkshed (the area from which milk is traditionally pooled by handlers selling into the Northeast Marketing Area), milk production declined 0.5 percent during 2007.

### **Class Utilization Changes**

Class I utilization averaged 45.5 percent in 2007, a decrease of 1.0 percentage point from the previous year. The total volume of milk used in Class I decreased slightly (0.5 percent). Class II usage increased 5.6 percent, largely due to an increase in yogurt, resulting in an increase in utilization of 0.8 percentage points. Class III volume was up 11.1 percent, primarily due to growth in cream cheese; this resulted in an increase in utilization of 2.1 percentage points. The amount of milk used in Class IV declined 15.6 percent in 2007; utilization dropped 1.9 percentage points. The decline was due mainly to less dried milk products, but also less condensed products and butter.

### **Producer Tests**

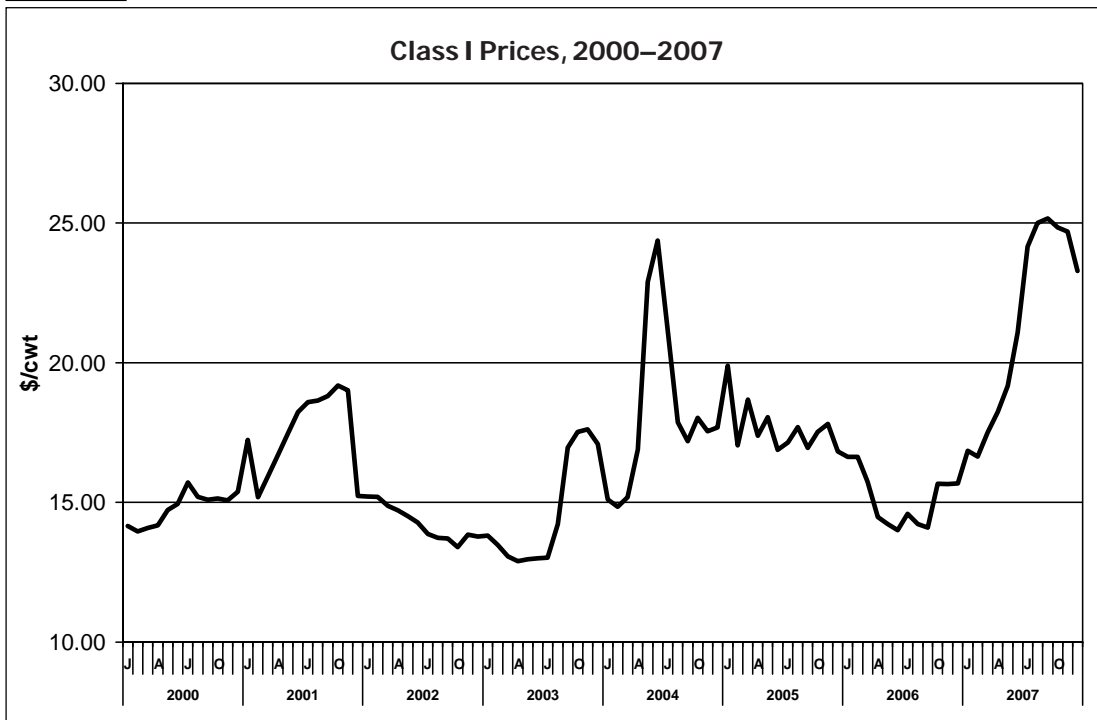
The annual average producer butterfat test declined slightly from 3.71 percent in 2006 to 3.70 percent in 2007. For seven of the months in 2007, the test was below the previous year, but in April and December it tied the record high for the respective month. The protein test averaged .02 percentage points higher than in 2006. It set new monthly records during eight months of the year and a new record high in November with 3.15 percent. Other solids tests were above the previous year during seven of the months and averaged .01 percentage points higher for the year. Monthly records were set during four of the months, while three tied the monthly record. ❖

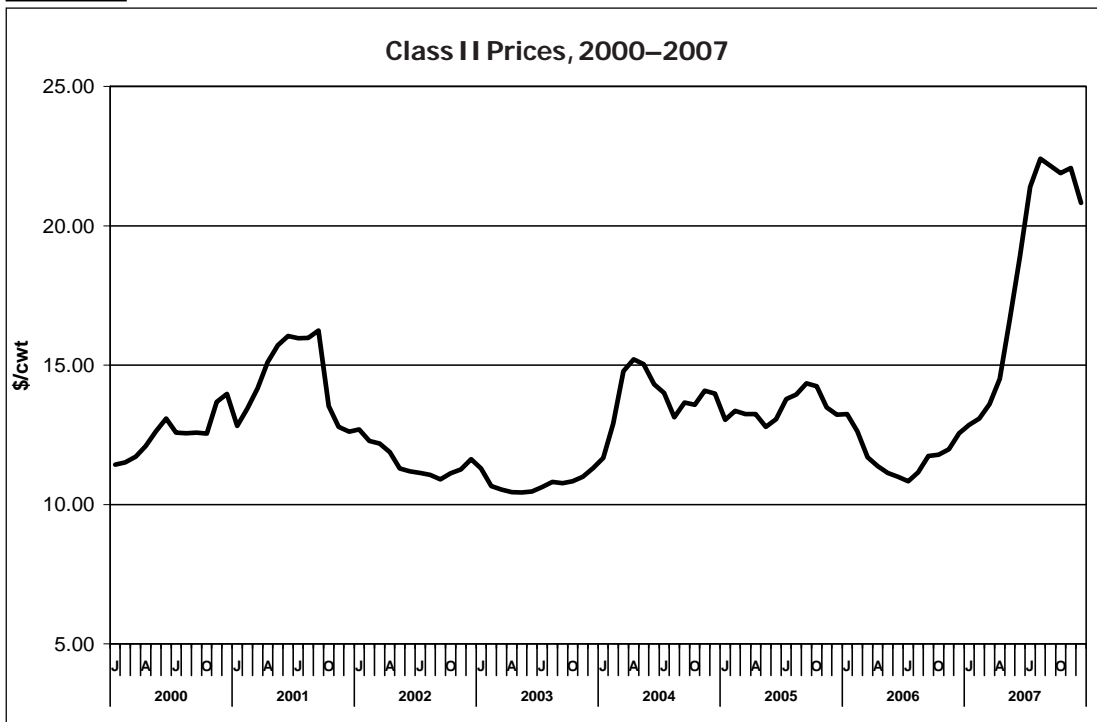

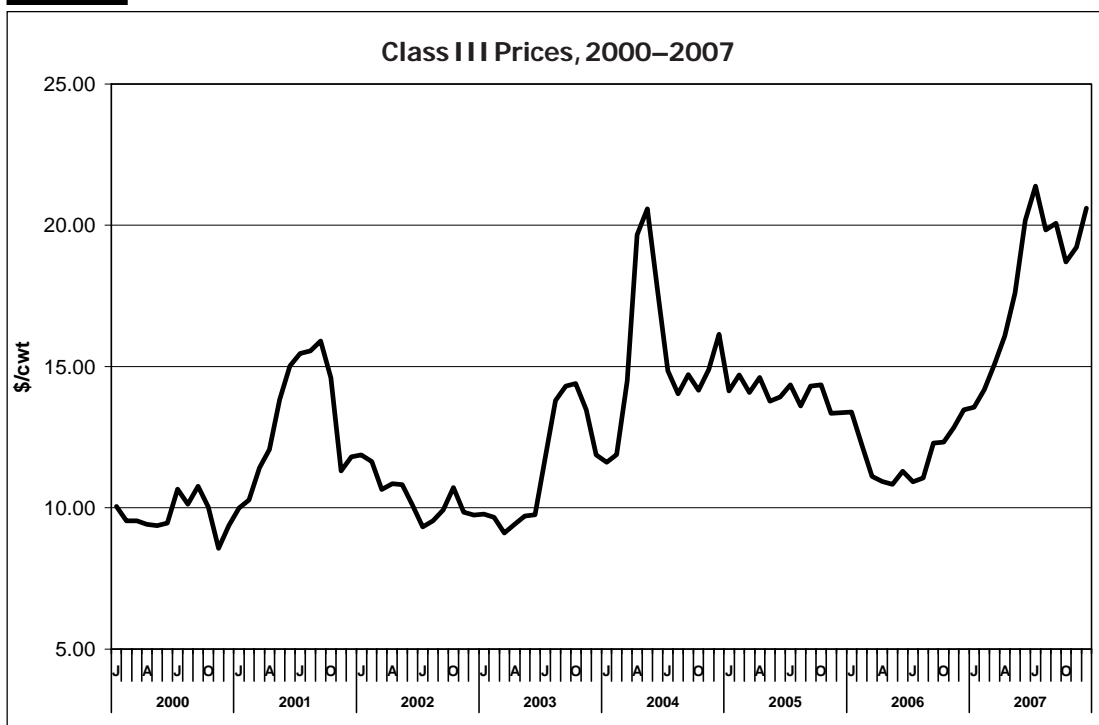

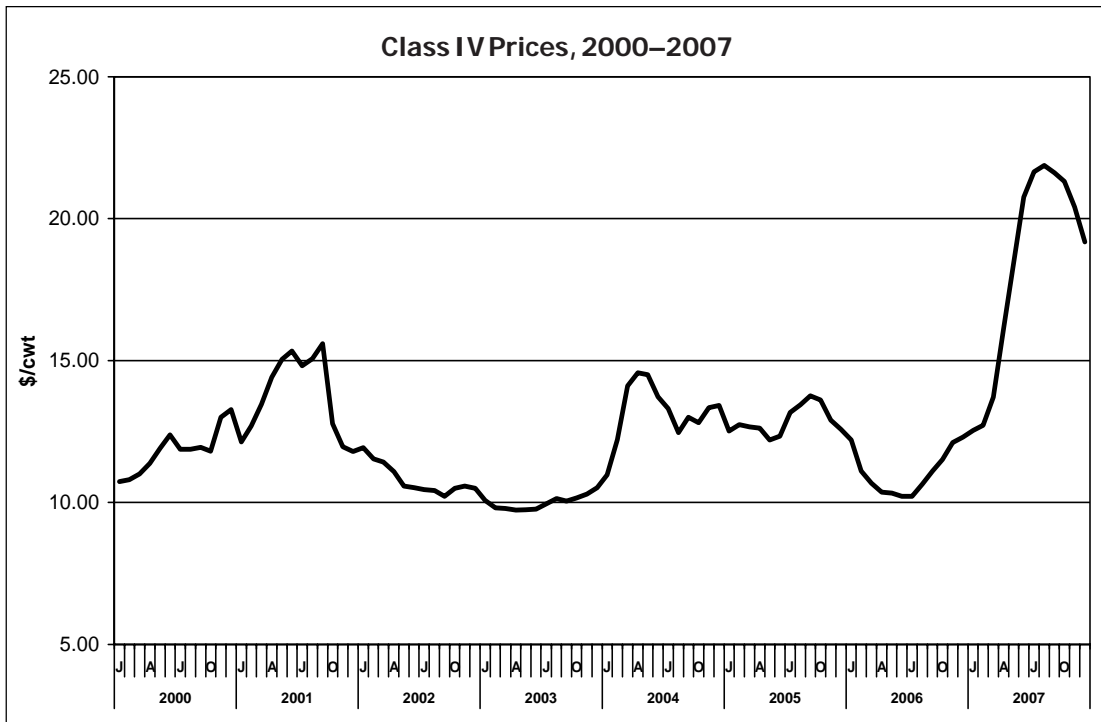

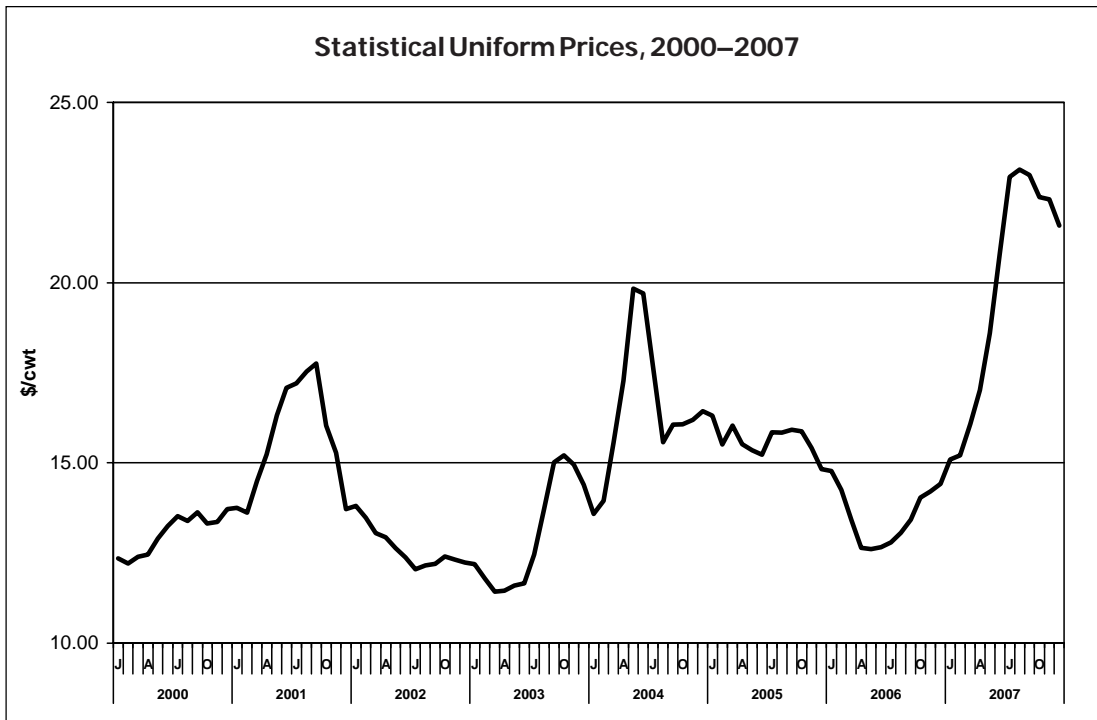

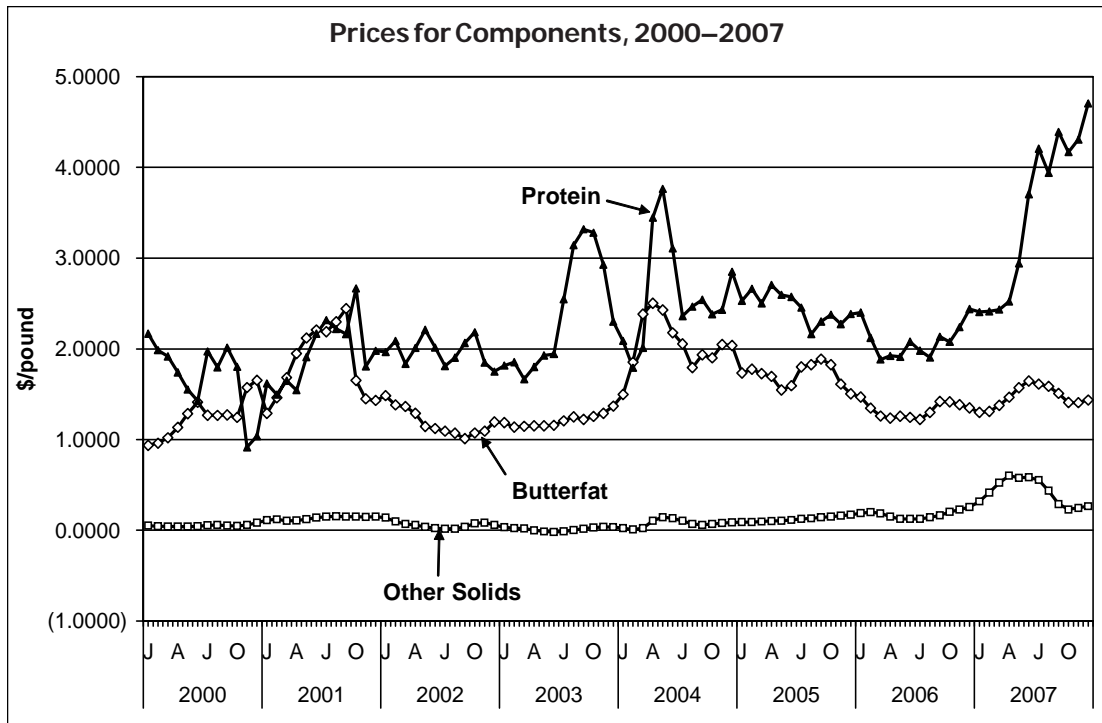

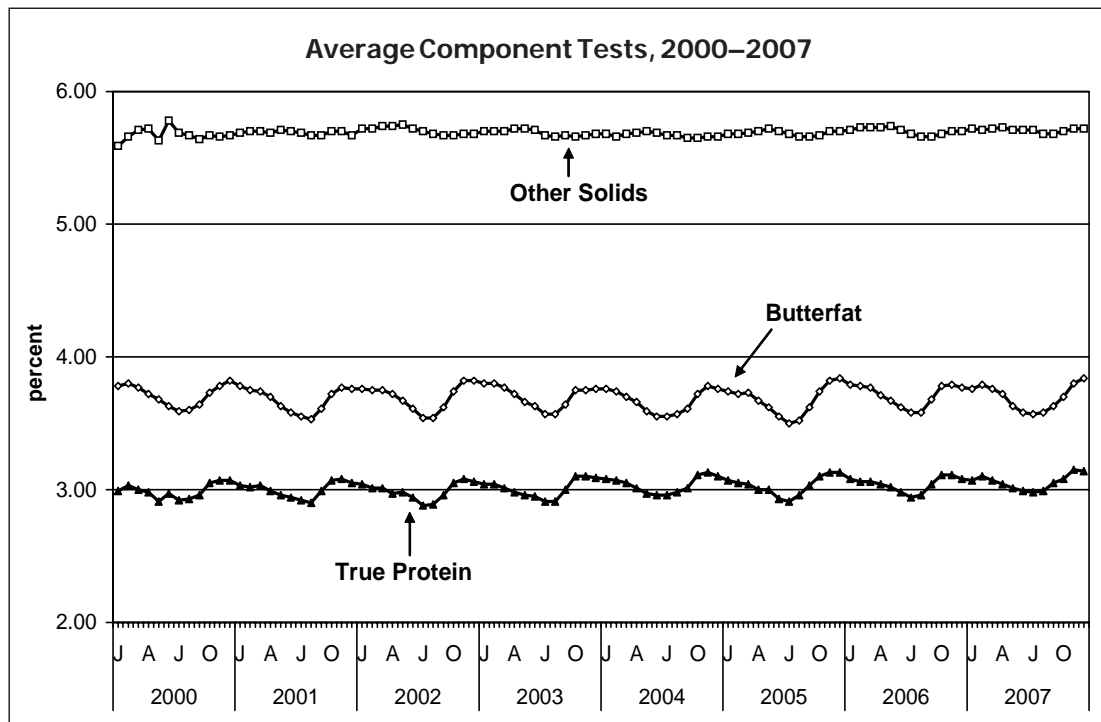

**9 Receipts of Milk from Producers by State\*, 2007**

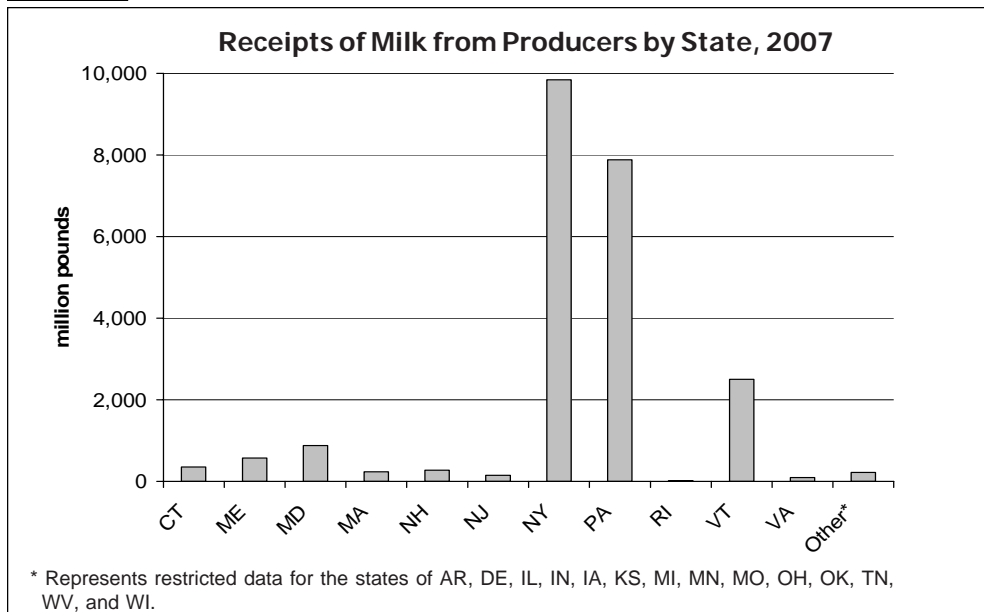

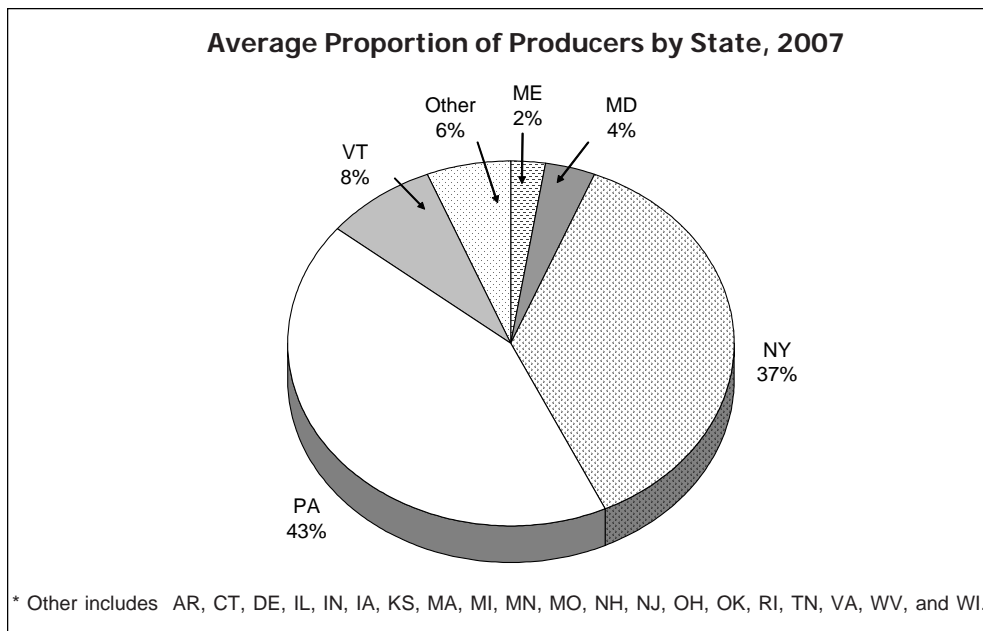

**11 Daily Average Output of Producer Milk per Farm by State\*, 2007**

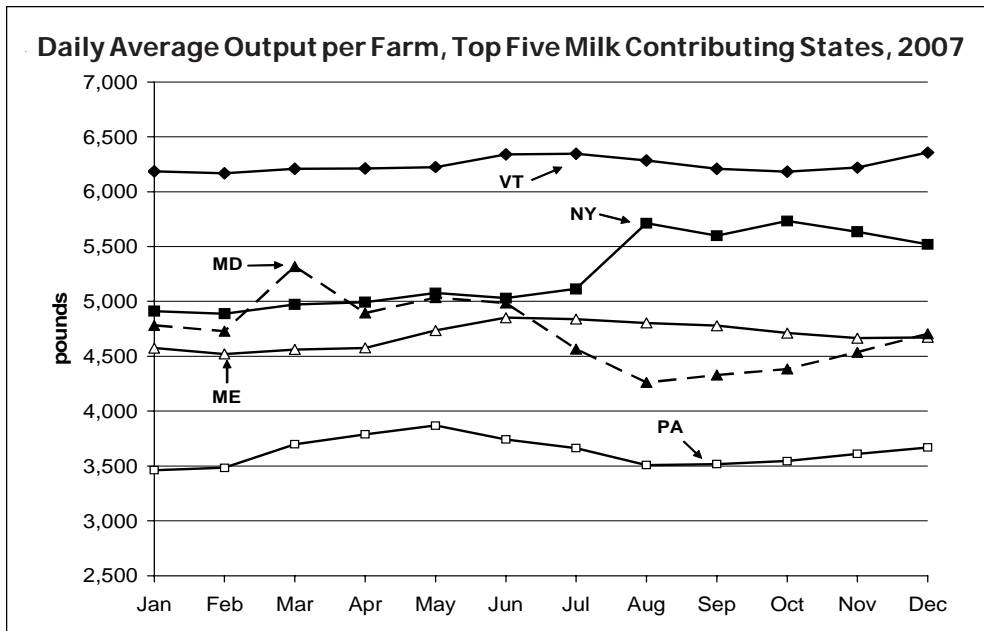

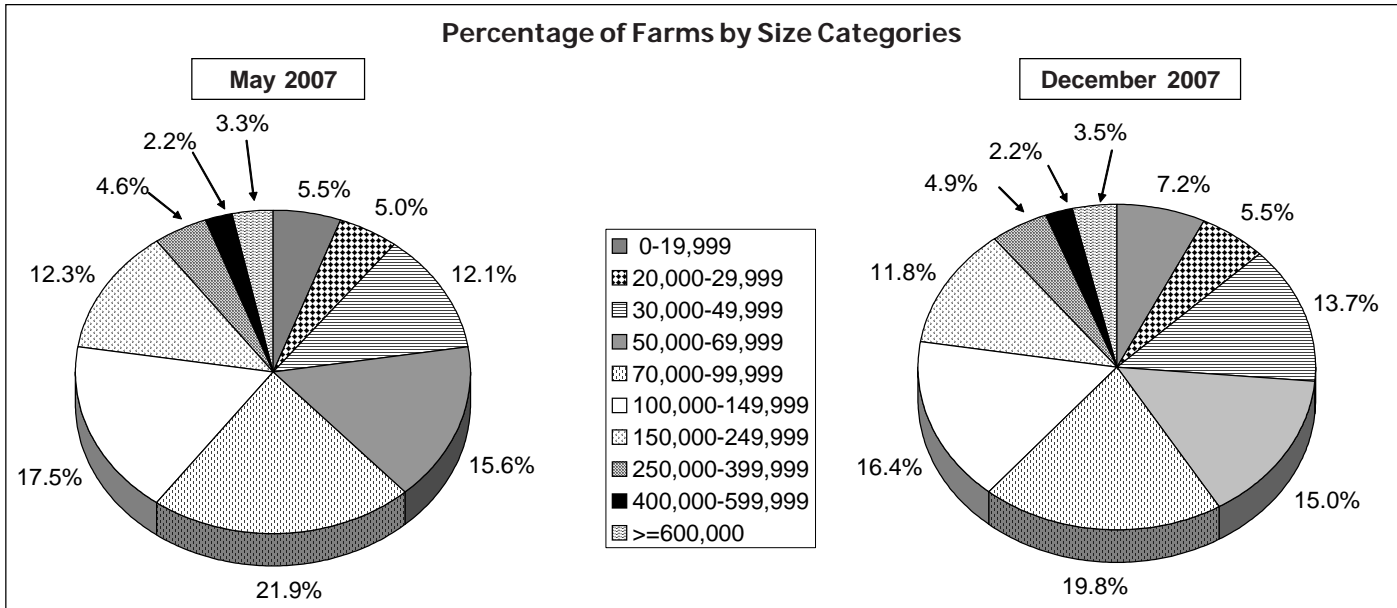

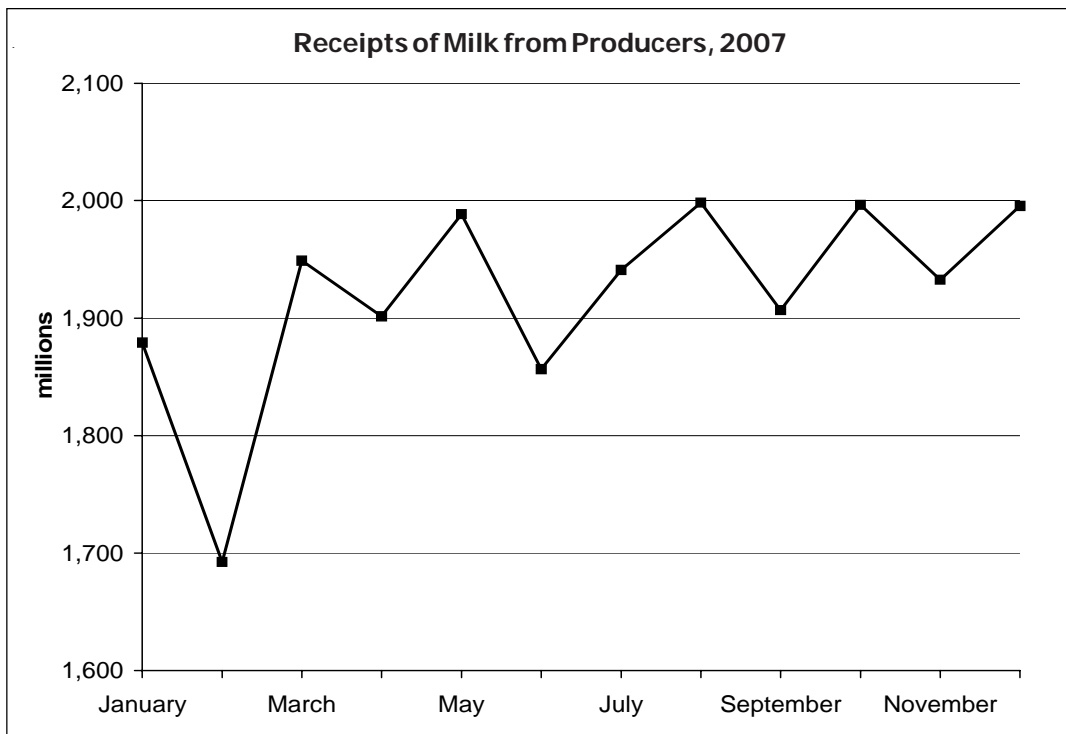
**Figure 12**

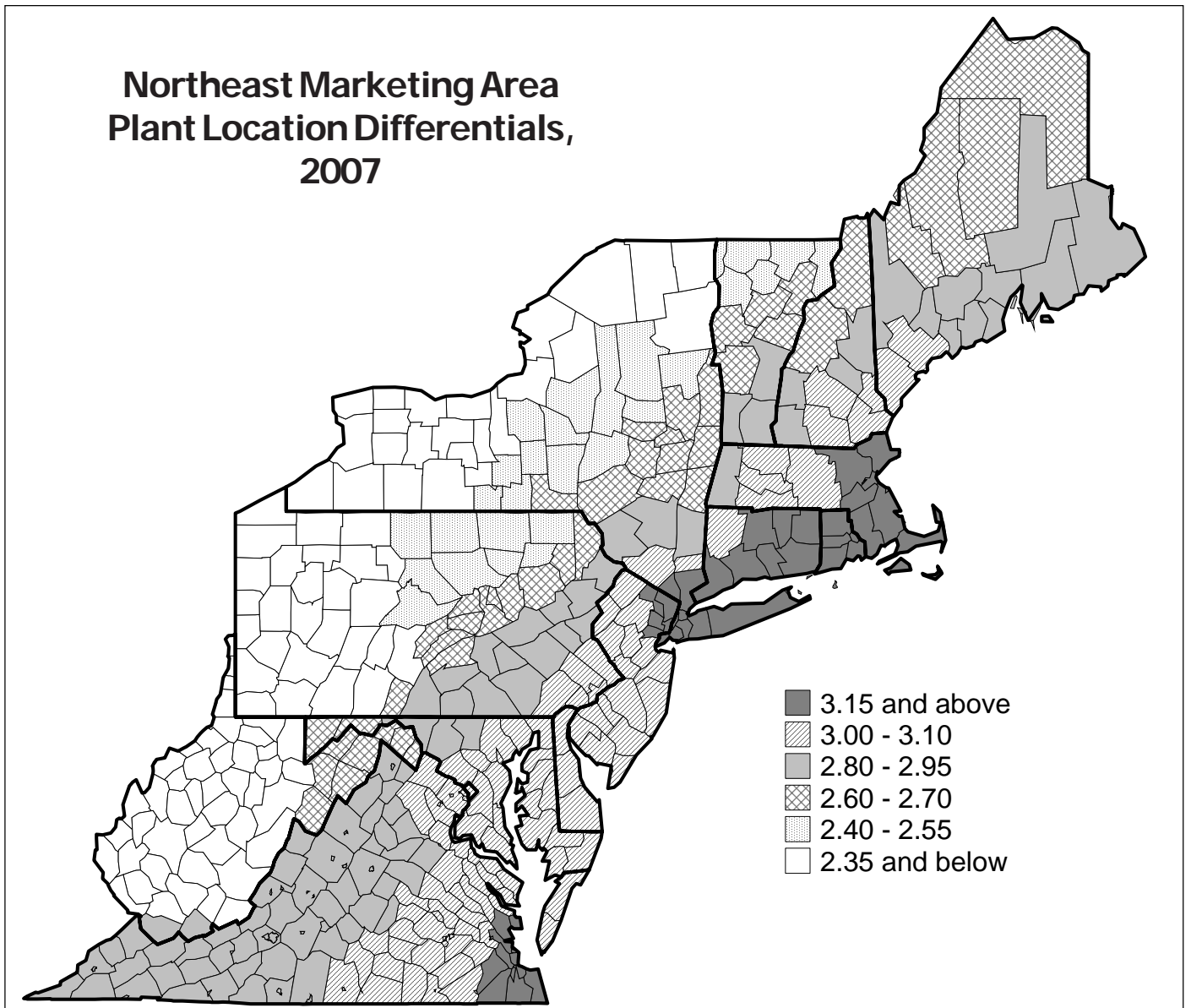

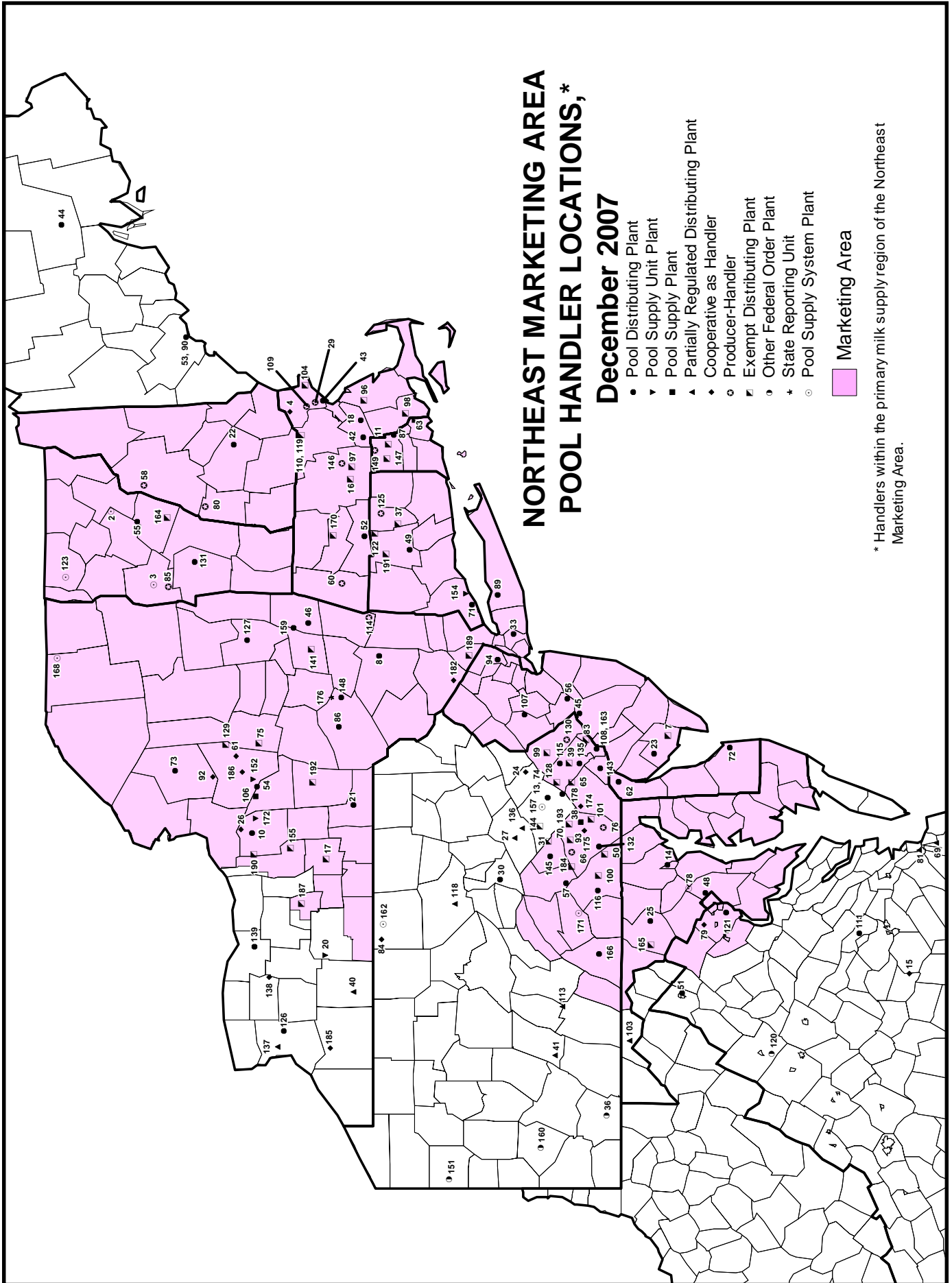

## Bulletin Highlights—2007

### January

USDA announced a hearing to consider and take evidence on proposals seeking to amend the Class III and Class IV product price formulas applicable to all Federal Milk Marketing Orders.

U.S. Milk production registered an increase of 2.8 percent in 2006. A table showed top ten states ranked by milk production.

Sales of Class I fluid milk products for 2006 in the Northeast Milk Marketing Area totaled 9.1 billion pounds, a decrease of 0.6 percent from 2005. Volume and percent change information for 2005 and 2006 were shown in a table while a chart illustrated per capita sales by product for 2006.

Data showed an increasing importance of other solids pricing in the composition of a producer's gross payment each month. A chart illustrated the composition of a hypothetical producer's gross payment for January 2007 under the Northeast Order.

### February

New Class III and Class IV price formulas that incorporated new make allowances became effective with prices announced on March 2, 2007.

The milk-feed price ratio in February 2006 was the lowest it's been since June 2003, indicating an economic environment resulting in production contraction. Charts illustrated the Northeast Order blend price versus the milk-feed price ratio for 2000–2007, and feed prices for 2005–2007.

The top ten counties in terms of milk pooled on the Northeast Order accounted for 32.1 percent of all milk pooled during the year. A table showed the top ten pooled milk contributing counties for 2006.

The Northeast Milk Marketing Area announced the tentative calibration truck schedule for 2007.

### March

A revision to the March class and component prices was issued due to the release of an additional week of data.

Producers pooled by handlers regulated under the Northeast Order shipped a total of 22.7 billion pounds of milk during 2006. A map showed Order No. 1 producer milk by location differential where utilized and produced for 2006.

Component tests were compared with charts illustrating producer butterfat, protein, and other solids prices versus 12-month moving average tests.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–March, 2006 and 2007.

### April

USDA announced it would reconvene a hearing to

consider proposals seeking to amend the Class III and Class IV product price formulas applicable to all federal milk marketing orders to receive additional testimony on proposed amendments published in the *Federal Register*.

USDA released their *Dairy Products 2006 Summary* publication, and a discussion was given of dairy products manufactured in the United States. A table showed selected U.S. manufactured dairy products for 2005 and 2006.

A chart showed the Northeast Order statistical uniform prices for 2003 through the end of 2007, with estimates for May through December 2007, projecting the blend prices to be above the \$20.00 per hundredweight during the last six months of 2007.

The Northeast Order set record-high Class I utilization for the first 3 months of 2007. The charts compared annual utilization for the Northeast Order in 2006 to 2002, and detailed the make-up of Class I utilization by product.

### May

The contribution to producer price by components was discussed and accompanied by a table showing the contribution by component for the month of May from 2004 through 2007, using a hypothetical farmer producing 100,000 pounds of milk at the pool average component tests during that month.

An explanation was given to why the Class II price has been the lowest class price of the four classes for the past 3 months under the Northeast Order. A chart compared nonfat dry milk and dry whey prices for 2006–2007.

The Northeast Order set record-high Class II utilization for the first 4 months of 2007. The accompanying charts compared annual utilization for the Northeast Order in 2006 to 2002, and detailed the make-up of Class II utilization by product.

### June

The Northeast Order announced record-setting prices since the Order's inception in January 2000, with a June statistical uniform price of \$20.80 per hundredweight. A chart showed blend prices at Boston, Massachusetts, for 2007 versus 2004.

An explanation was given to why, since 2003, the Northeast Order Class III utilization has averaged less than 25 percent. The accompanying charts compared annual utilization for the Northeast Order in 2006 to 2002, and detailed the make-up of Class III utilization by product.

USDA issued an interim final rule establishing a Dairy Product Mandatory Reporting Program to provide

timely, accurate, and reliable market information.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–June, 2006 and 2007.

### July

An explanation was given to why milk prices have been outpacing the feed price. A chart showed the Northeast Order blend price versus the milk-feed price ratio for 2000–2007.

The Class IV volume pooled on the Northeast Order for the first half of 2007 was 1.1 billion pounds, the smallest volume for the first half of a year since 2000. The accompanying charts compared annual utilization for the Northeast Order in 2006 to 2002, and detailed the make-up of Class IV utilization by product.

Milk production in the U.S. was up 1.0 percent for the first 6 months of 2007; however, this is a lower increase than the previous year. A map showed the year-to-year percent change of milk production in the top 23 milk producing states for the first 6 months of 2007.

### August

Bulk milk movements by handlers pooled on the Northeast Order, as well as by handlers pooled on other federal orders, were discussed. A table illustrated the milk movements to and from the Northeast Order for the month of August in 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007.

Component tests were compared with charts illustrating average producer butterfat, protein, and other solids tests versus prices.

The contribution to the producer price by components was discussed and accompanied by a table showing the contribution by component for the month of August from 2004 through 2007, using a hypothetical farmer producing 100,000 pounds of milk at the pool average component tests during that month.

### September

Northwest Dairy Association and Dairy Farmers of America, Inc. requested a public hearing upon their proposal to expand the Pacific Northwest Federal Milk Marketing (Order 124) Area.

For the first time since 1996, the Commodity Credit Corporation did not purchase any products under the dairy price support program for the marketing year October 1, 2006, through September 30, 2007.

Bulk milk movements by handlers pooled on the Northeast Order, as well as by handlers pooled on other federal orders, were discussed for the month of September 2007.

A pool summary for all federal orders was given in a table for January–September, 2006 and 2007.

Class I utilization for September 2007 pooled on the

Northeast order set a record for the lowest volume ever for that month since the Order's inception. Charts illustrated the Class I pounds pooled under the Northeast Order and the Class I price at Boston for 2000–2007.

### October

USDA reopened the comment period for the interim final rule for the Dairy Product Mandatory Reporting program for an additional 30 days.

The 2007 Northeast Regional Dairy Outlook Conference was held on November 8 at the Northeast Order's Albany office. A table showed the statistical uniform prices for 2006, the actual and estimated prices for 2007, and the estimated prices for 2008.

Increased dairy exports were credited with playing a big role in maintaining the record-high milk prices for 2007. Accompanying charts showed U.S. dairy export volume and value for 1994–2006, U.S. dairy export value for selected products and U.S. dairy volume for selected products, for January through June, 2006 and 2007.

### November

An increase in sales of fluid milk products in the Northeast Milk Marketing Area was discussed for October and November 2007. A table showed Class I in-area sales under the Order for September through November 2007.

Mailbox prices for all federal order areas averaged \$8.90 per hundredweight higher for September 2007 compared to September 2006. An accompanying table showed regional mailbox prices for all federal order areas for September, 2006 and 2007.

A calendar was given that showed the dates for partial payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. The Order requirement was explained.

Prices paid to organic milk and conventional (non-organic) milk producers were compared for October 2007 and a table showed selected statistics for those identified to the Market Administrator from the month's payroll data.

### December

Selected Northeast Order statistics for 2007 were summarized and a table compared the Order's pool statistics for 2006 and 2007.

An explanation was given on how producers are paid under the Order and how the proportions vary throughout the year, accompanied by a chart illustrating the contribution of components to the Northeast Order statistical uniform price for 2007.

Cooperative membership status was discussed highlighting a slight decline in cooperative members and percent of milk pooled on the Order. ❖
