

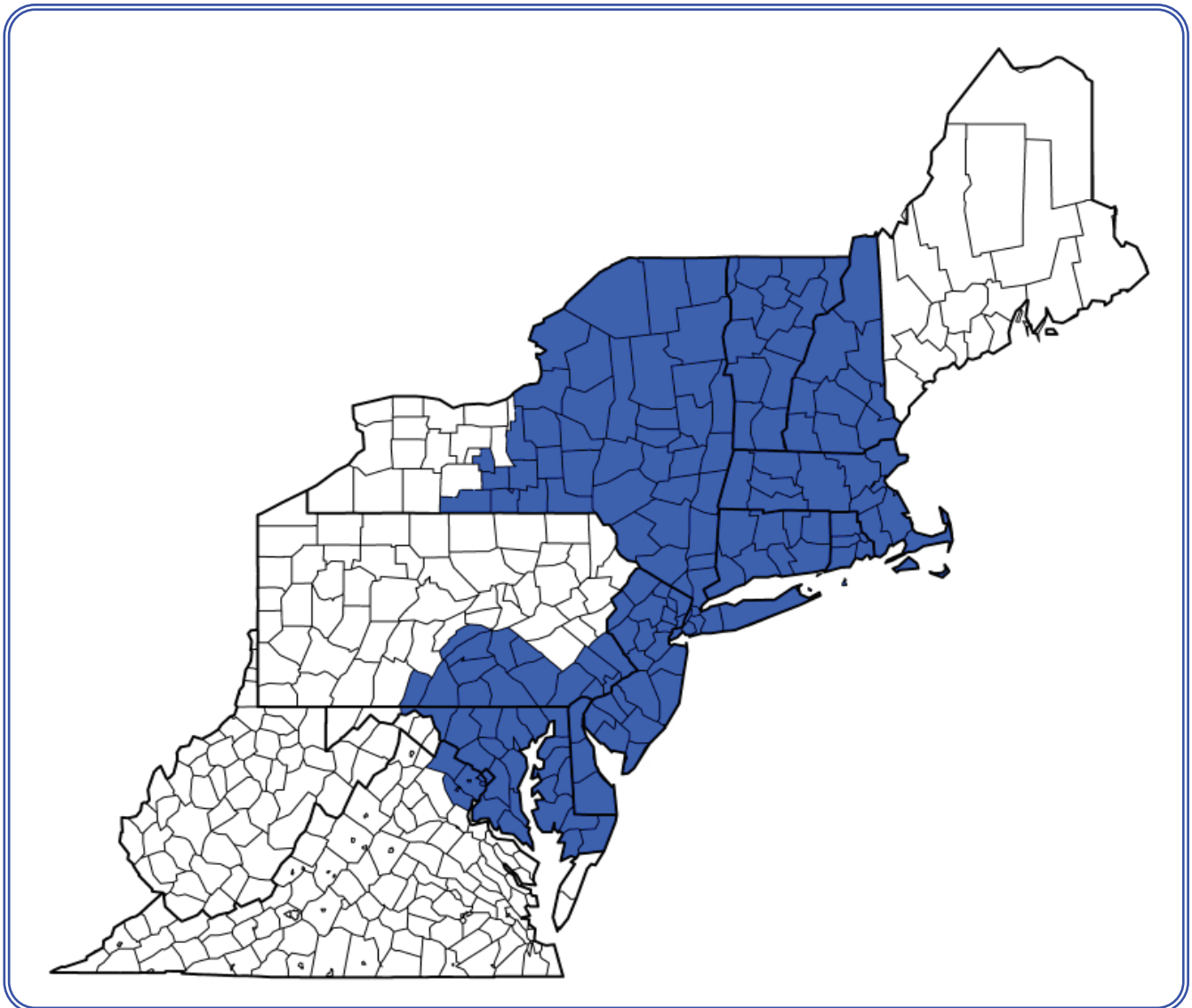
The Market Administrator's Annual Statistical Bulletin

Northeast Milk Marketing Area
Federal Order No. 1

2023

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Summary

This bulletin provides information about the operation of the Northeast Order during 2023 through a series of tables and charts. The *Bulletin* Highlights section summarizes important events that impacted the dairy industry in 2023. Also included are lists of handlers and cooperatives operating under the Order with their respective locations depicted on a map of the region.

Order Volume Increases

Total milk received from producers equaled 27.3 billion pounds in 2023, up 1.4 percent from 2022, and the second highest total volume since the Order's inception. The annual average volume per producer continued to set record-highs jumping 836 pounds from the previous year; it topped 10,000 pounds for 2 months during 2023 and over 9,000 during all other months. The year ended with 7,640 producers, a drop of 444 from December 2022; the decrease was 665 the previous year.

Class Utilization Changes

Class I utilization averaged 28.8 percent in 2023, down 0.8 percentage points from 2022. The volume of milk used for Class I purposes declined 101 million pounds (1.3 percent) from the previous year, compared to a drop of 2.2 percent in 2022. The total volume of producer receipts used in Class II jumped 541 million pounds (8.5 percent) and set a record high in usage. The Class II utilization percentage rose 1.7 percentage points to 25.5 percent of total producer milk pooled in 2023. Significant increases occurred in milk used in yogurt, cottage cheese, and sour cream.

Class III volume also set a record high, increasing 2.2 percent (169 million pounds); utilization averaged 29.2 percent, up 0.2 percentage points from 2022. The category that includes Swiss and other hard varieties of cheese had the most growth. In addition, even though milk assigned to the lowest class price (shrinkage, dumped, animal feed, lost in transit) declined, the Class III price was the lowest for all but one month of 2023. The amount of milk used in Class IV decreased 4.9 percent and accounted for an annual average of 16.5 percent utilization, a decrease of 1.1 percentage points.

Prices Lower Than in 2022

With increases in milk production, demand struggled to keep up. As a result, prices dropped significantly from the previous year. Cold storage stocks of natural cheese set a record high in November 2023.

Commodity Prices—National Dairy Product Sales Report (NDPSR) butter prices decreased 8.7 percent

from 2022 and averaged \$2.6170 per pound, the second highest on record since federal order reform. NDPSR cheese prices averaged \$1.7593 per pound, a decrease of 16.7 percent with combined averages of \$1.8154 for blocks and \$1.6813 for barrels, declines of 13.6 and 19.6 percent, respectively.

The NDPSR nonfat dry milk price fell 29.6 percent from 2022, averaging \$1.1856 per pound. Dry whey prices dropped 40.3 percent from the previous year and averaged \$0.3618 per pound.

Component Prices—All component price averages were below the previous year. The price paid to producers for butterfat averaged \$2.9615 per pound, down 9.3 percent from 2022 and but the second highest price since federal order reform. The annual average protein price was \$1.9051 per pound, a drop of 30.1 percent from the previous year's average. The other solids price averaged \$0.1676 per pound, a decrease of 60.0 percent from 2022. The nonfat solids price averaged \$1.0076 per pound, a decline of 32.9 percent from the previous year.

Class Prices—Annual average class prices were significantly lower than in 2022. The Class I price averaged \$22.45 per hundredweight in 2023, down 16.6 percent from the 2022 annual average. The Class II price averaged \$20.10 per hundredweight, a decrease of 20.5 percent from the previous year. The Class III price averaged \$17.02, 22.5 percent below 2022. The Class IV price averaged \$19.12, a decline of 21.9 percent. Overall, the statistical uniform price (blend) reported at Suffolk County, Massachusetts (Boston) averaged \$20.01 per hundredweight, 19.8 percent below the 2022 average. The producer price differential (PPD) averaged \$2.99 per hundredweight (at Boston) for the year, one cent below the 2022 average and the third highest annual average since the Order's inception.

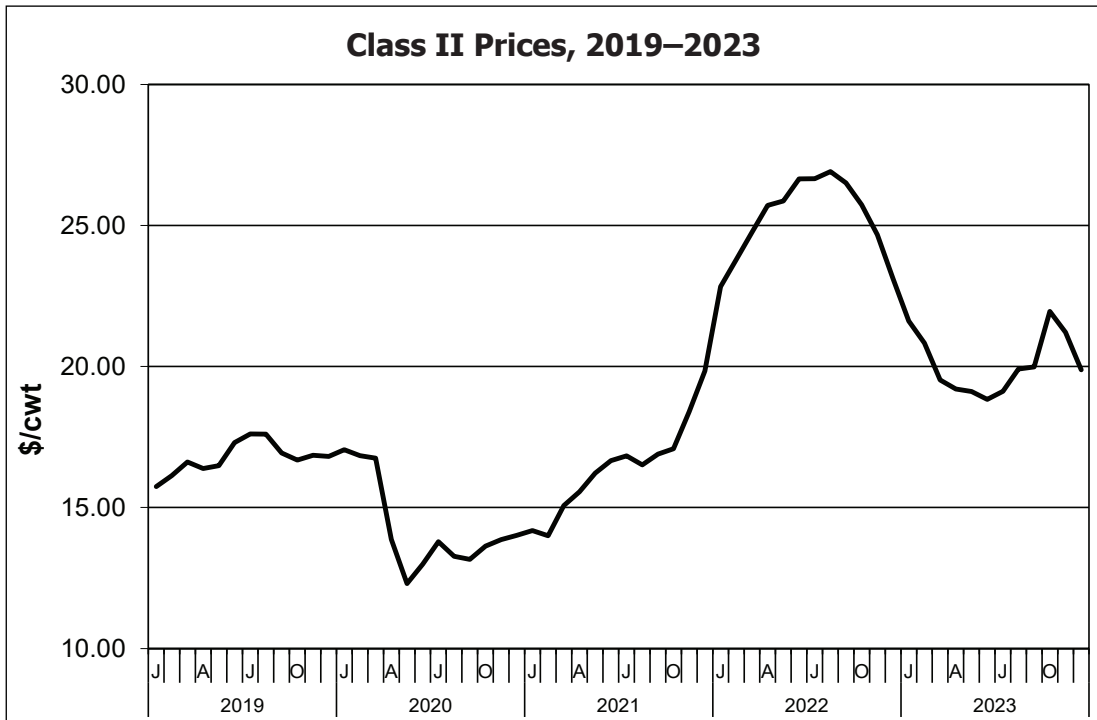
Producer Tests

The annual average producer butterfat test equaled 4.12 percent in 2023, a jump of 0.09 percentage points from 2022. Monthly record-highs were set in all but one month of 2023 and tied in that month. A new Order high was set in December at 4.30 percent. The annual average producer protein test was 3.18 percent, up 0.02 percentage points from the previous year. Monthly record-highs were set in 8 months of 2023 and a new Order high was set in November at 3.27 percent. The producer other solids test averaged 5.77 percent, a decrease of 0.01 percentage point. The year's record high was 5.79 percent, which matched multiple occurrences in prior years.

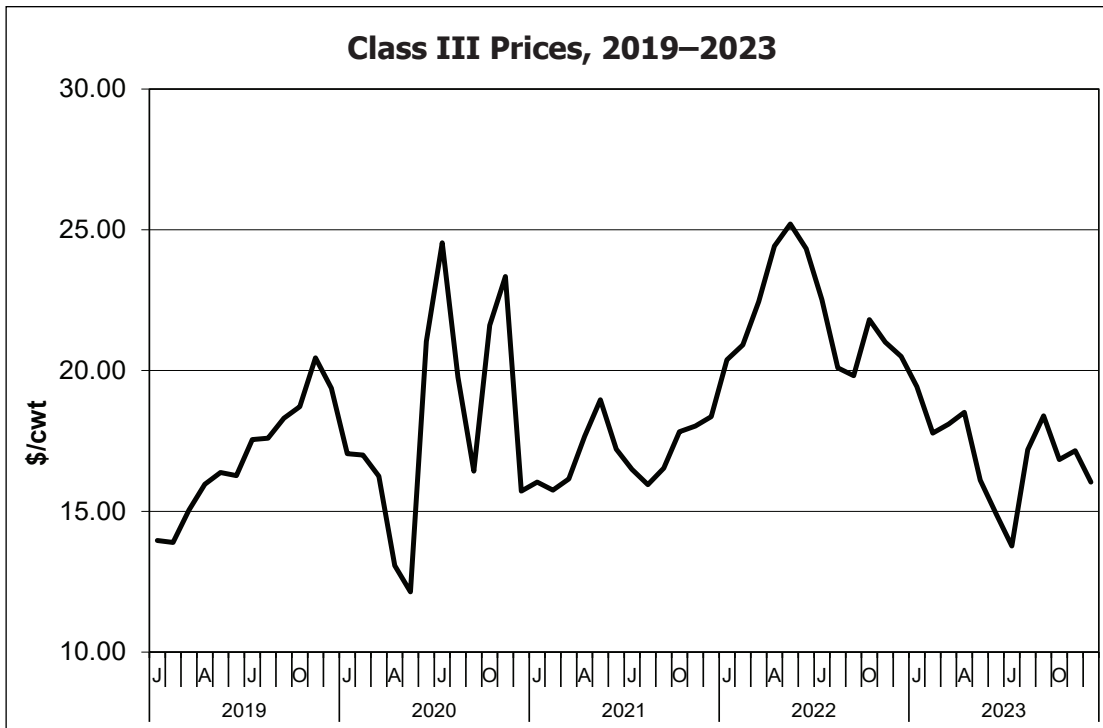

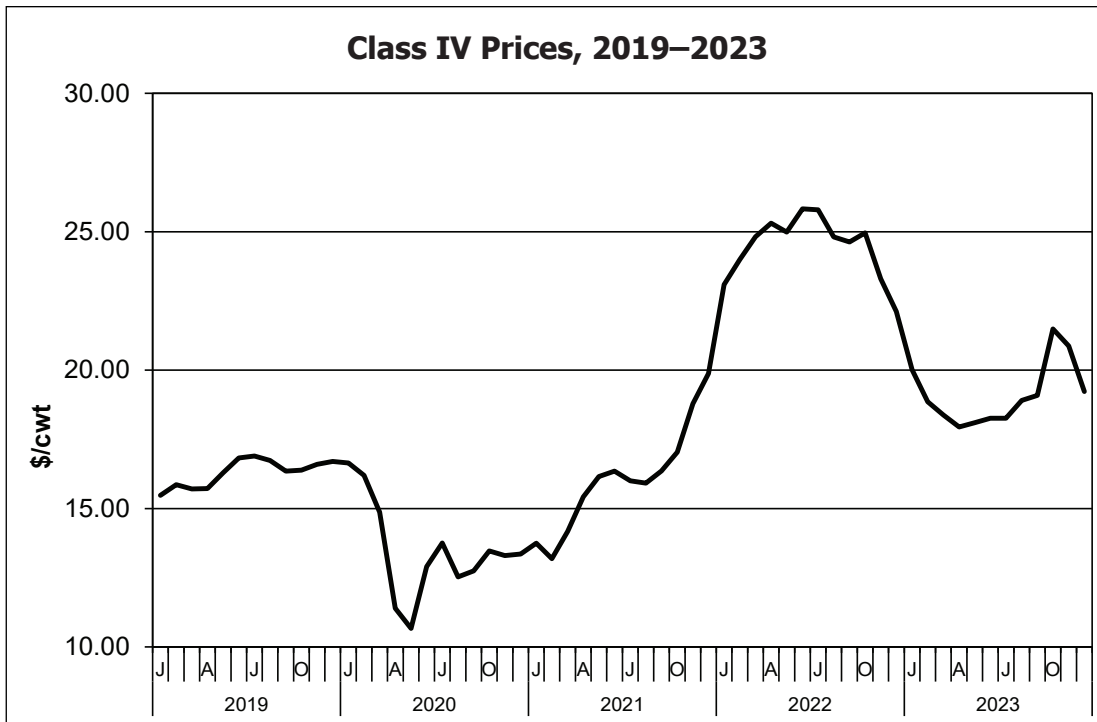

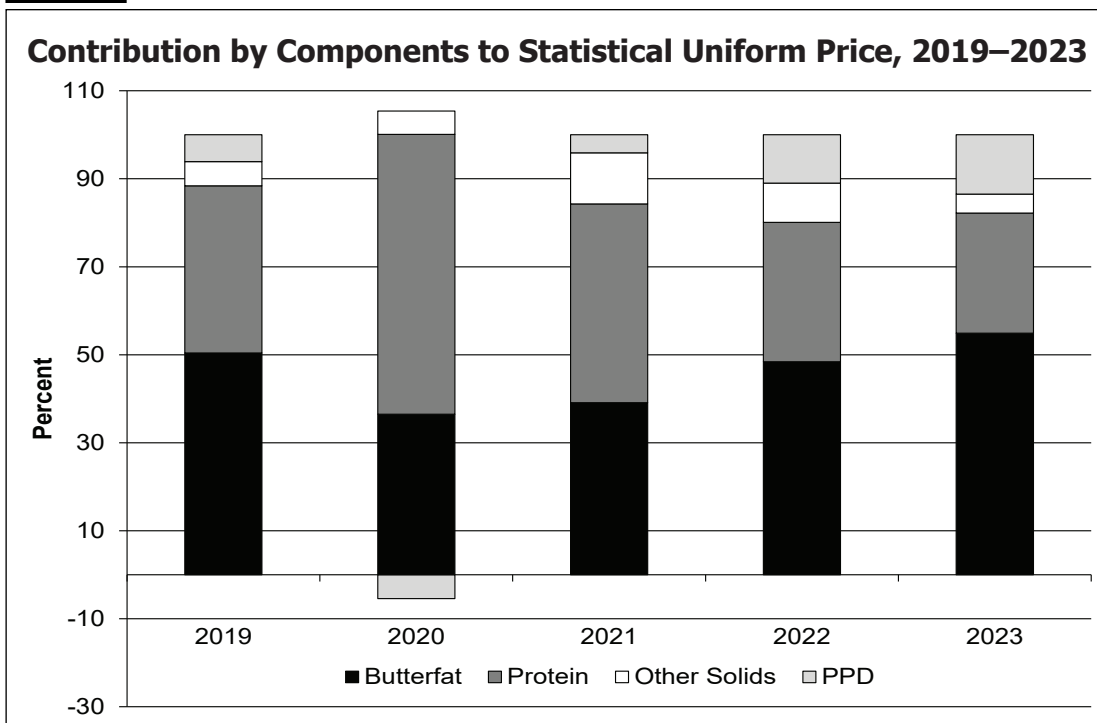


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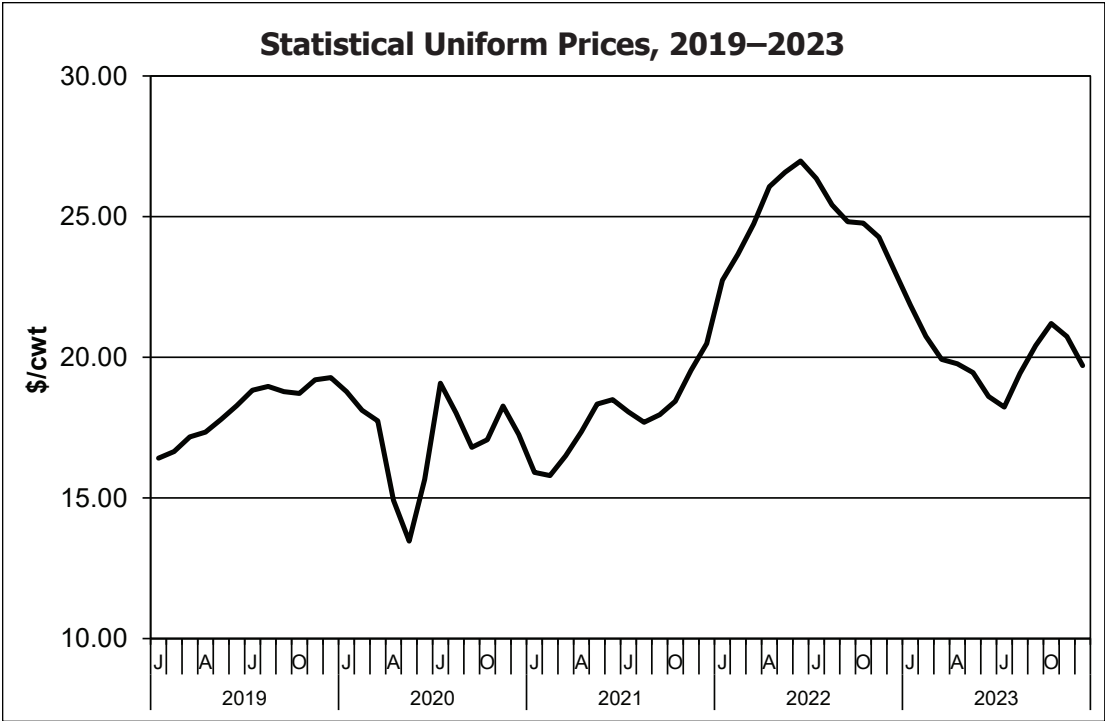
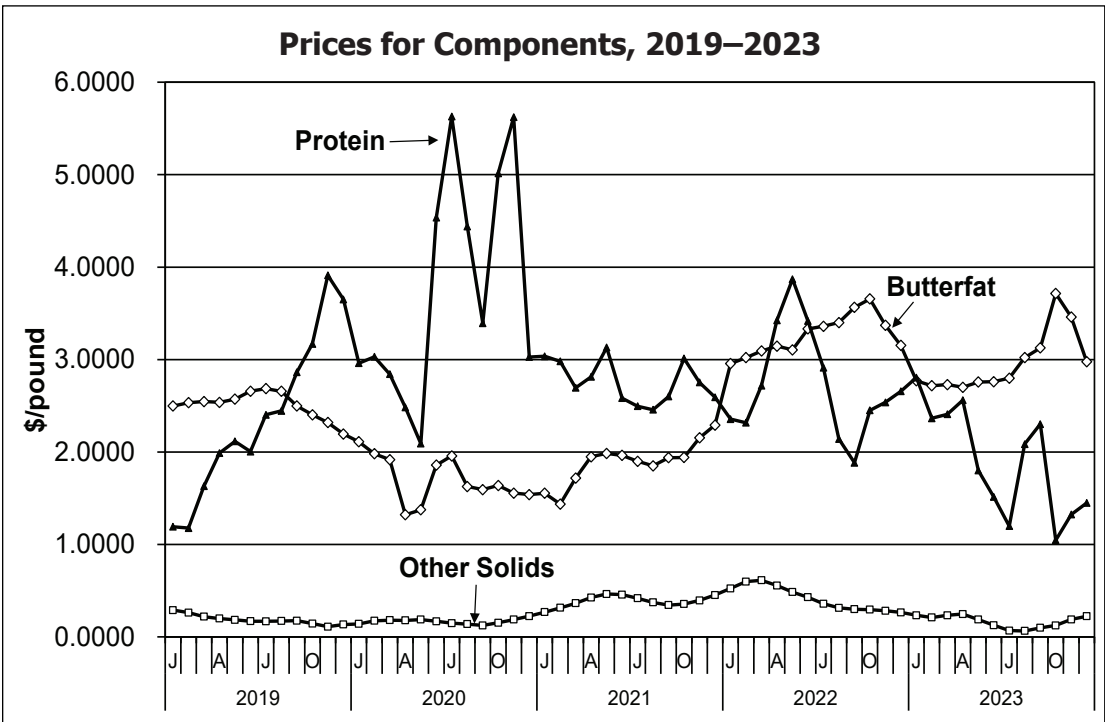

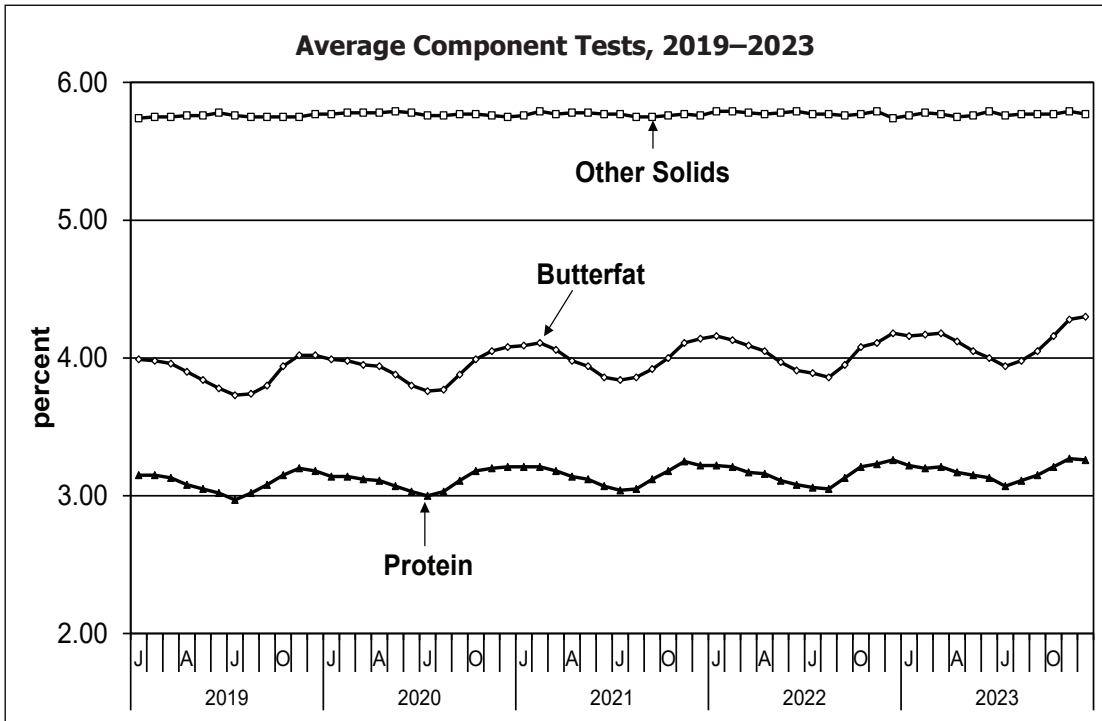

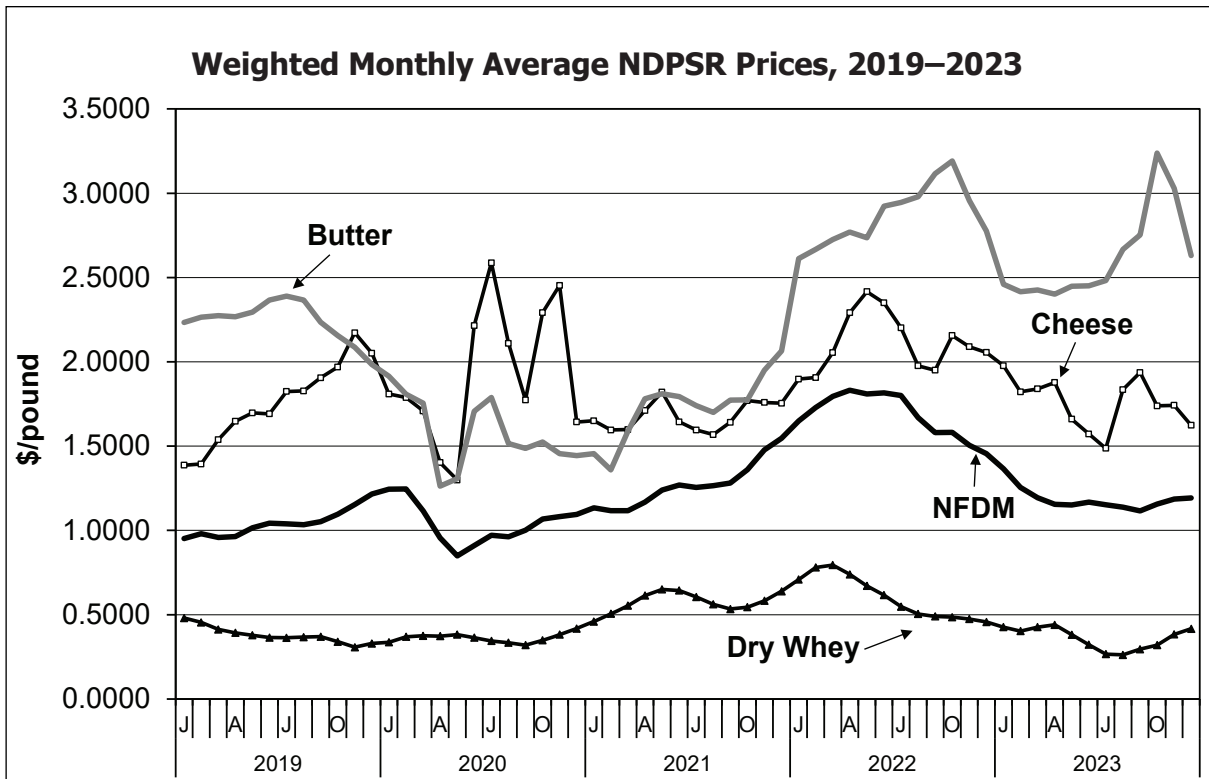

9 Receipts of Milk from Producers, by State*, 2023

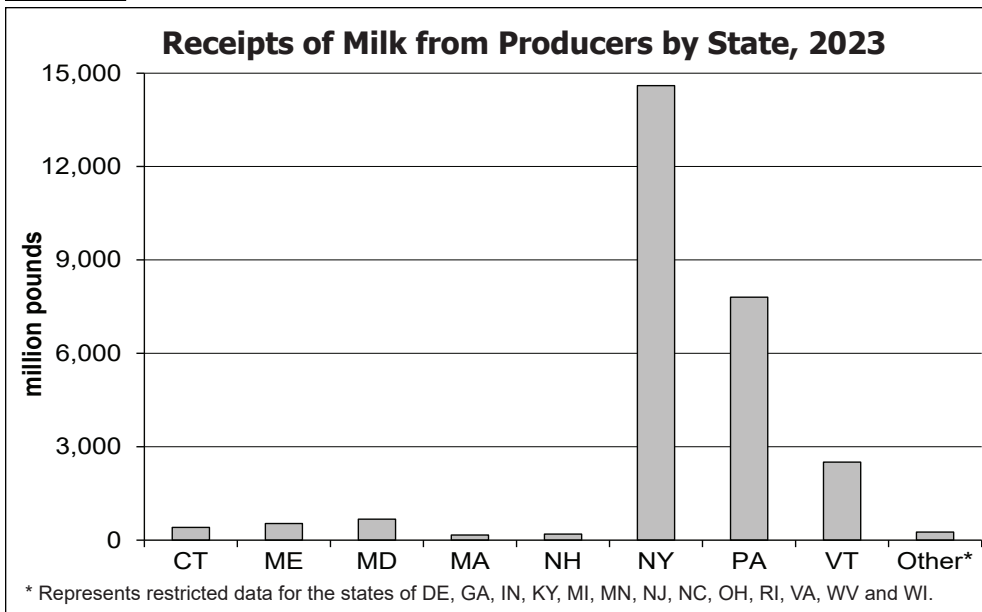

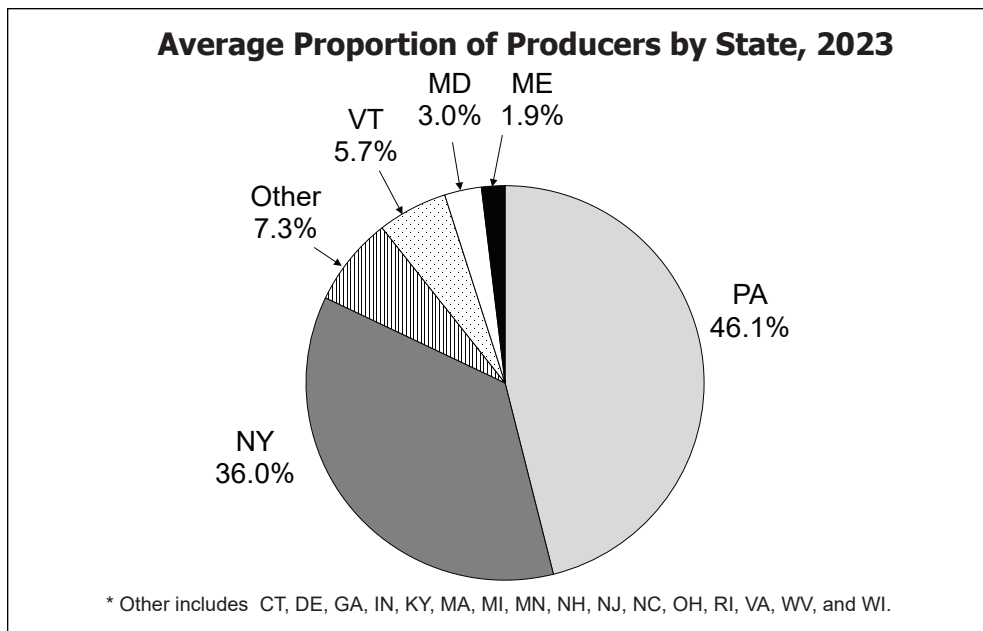

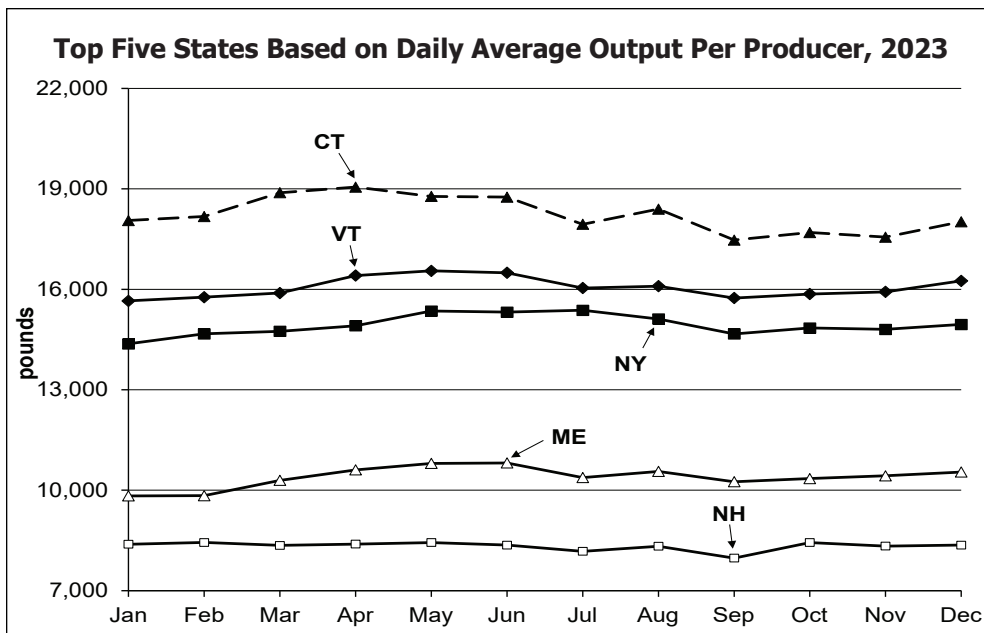

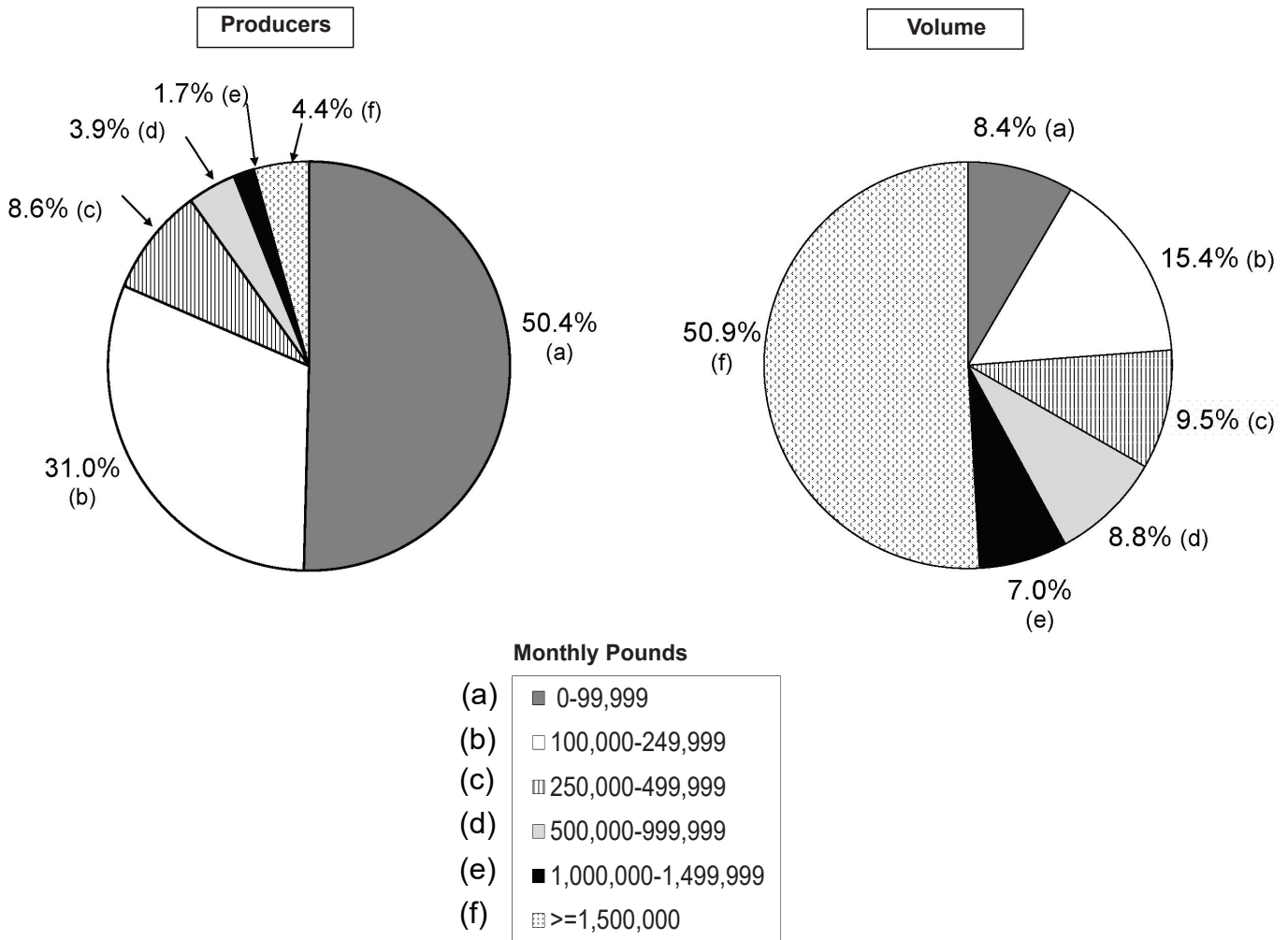

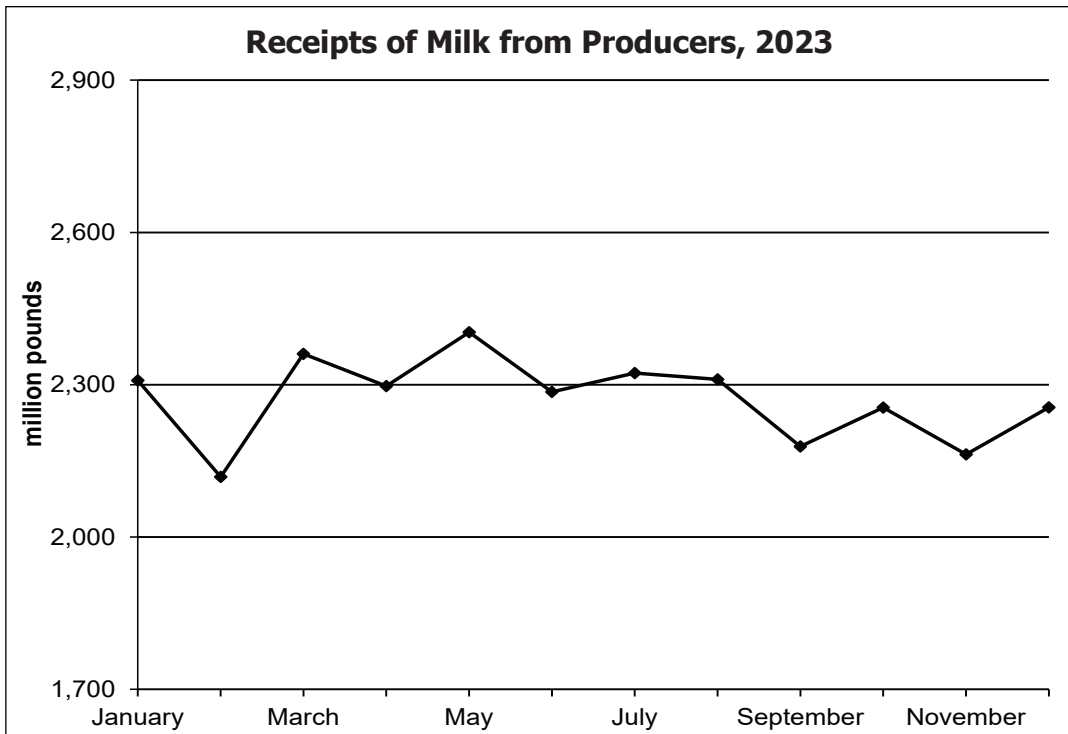
Percentage of Producers and Volume by Size Categories, December 2023

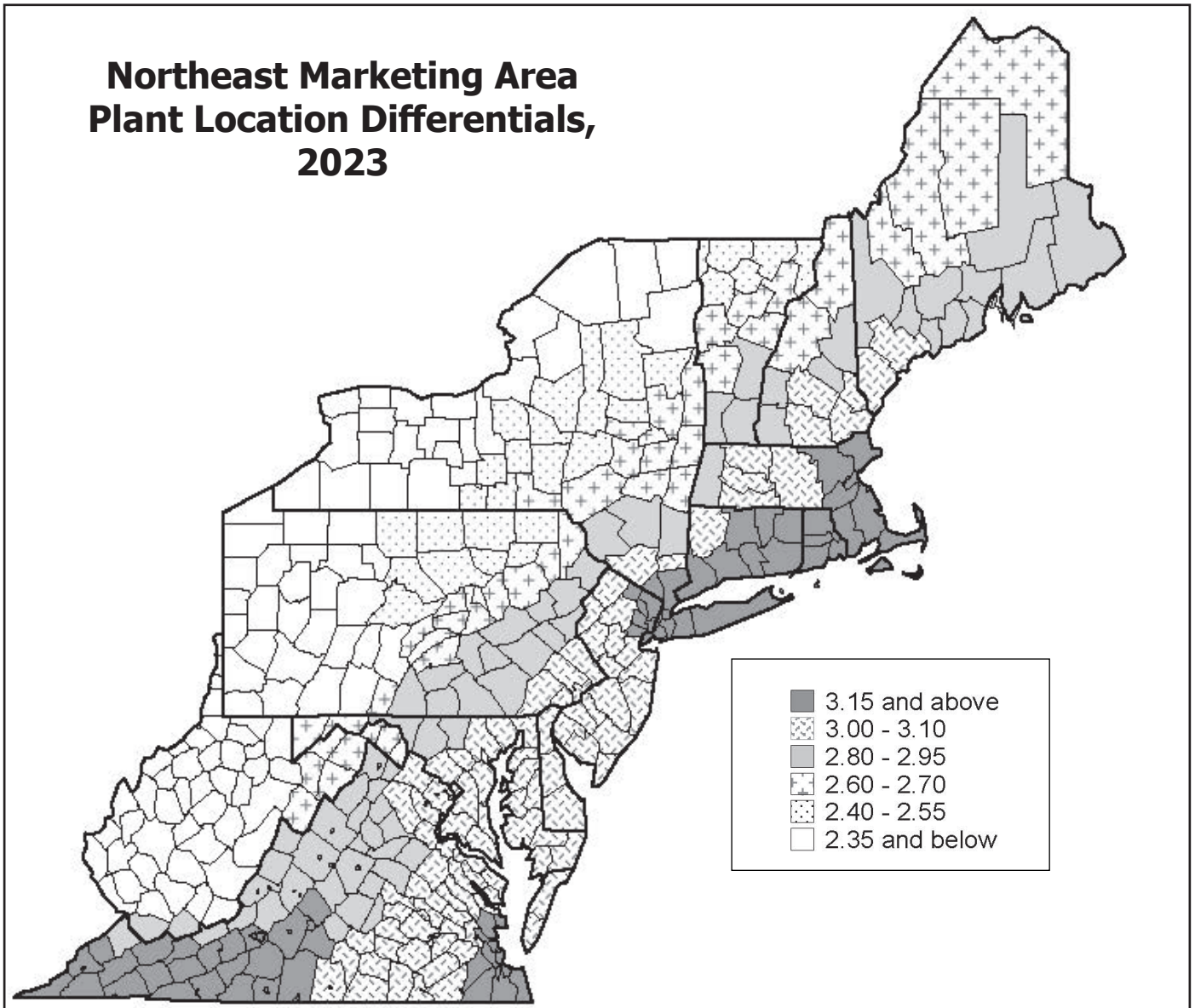

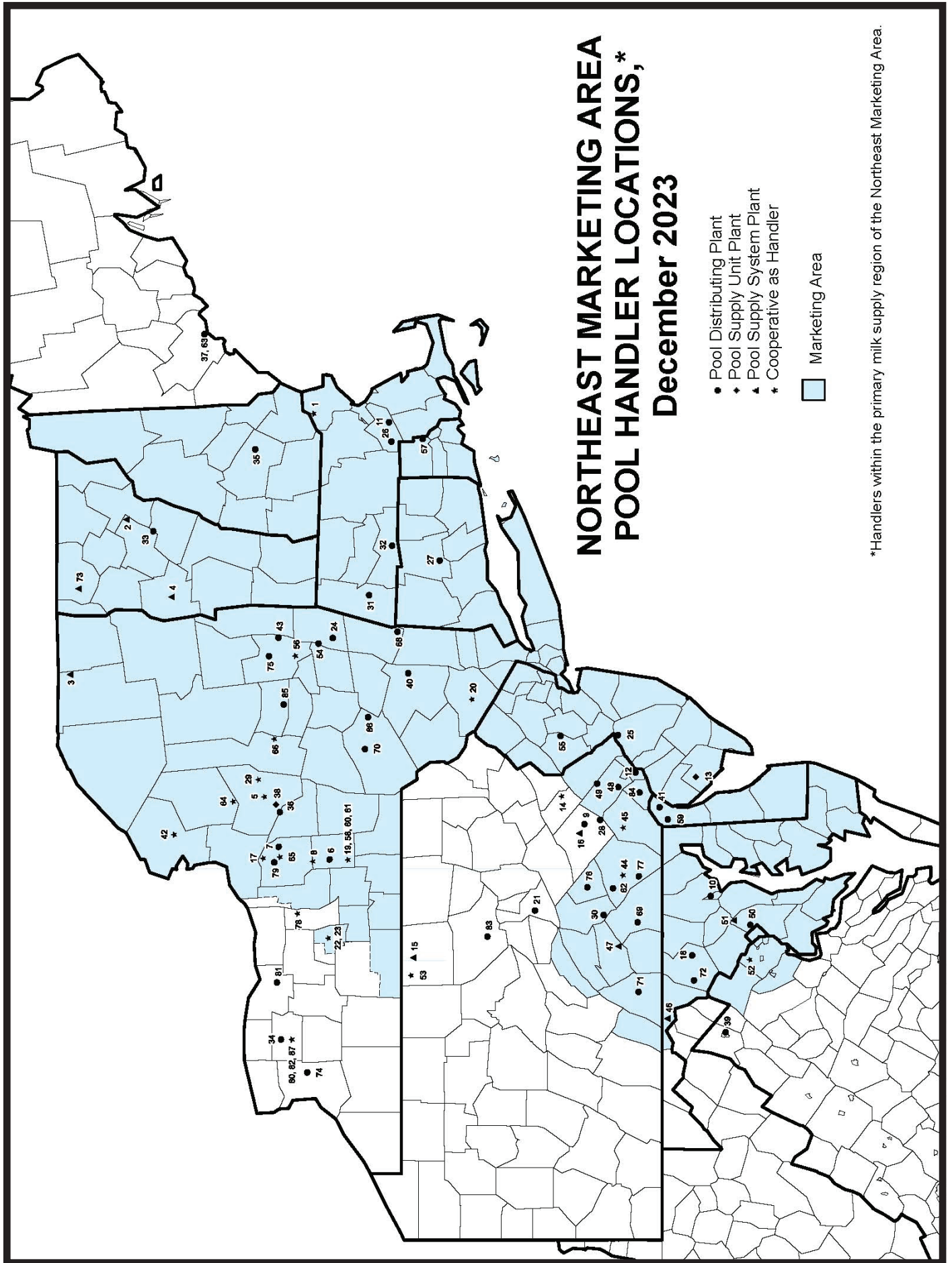

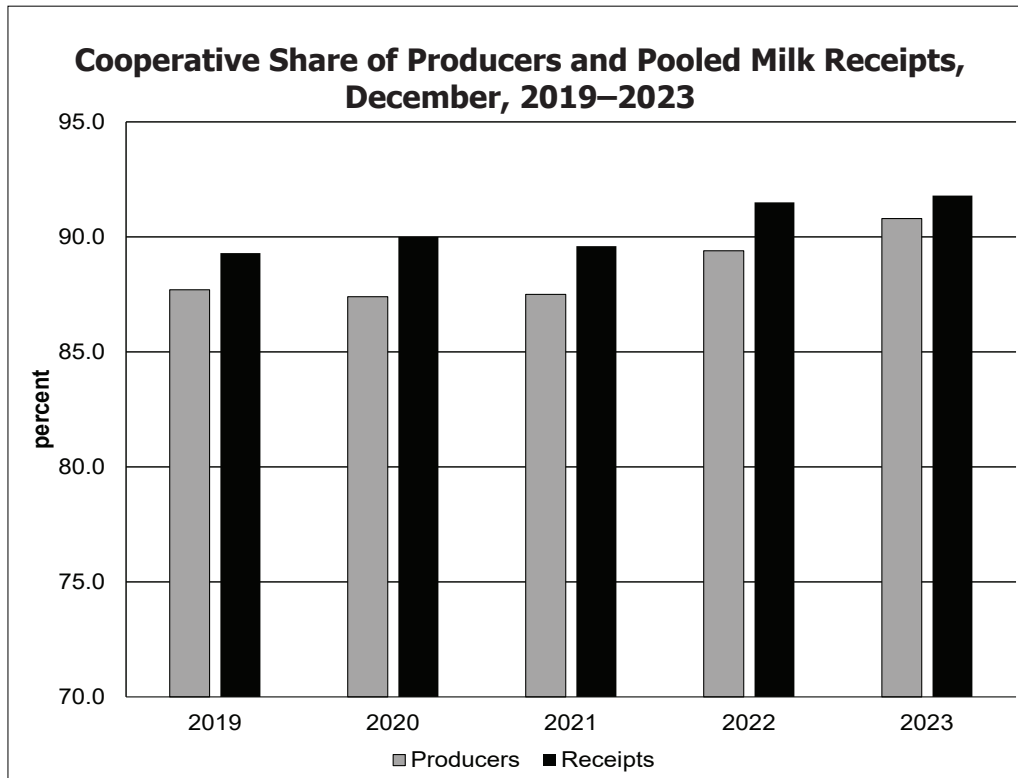

Bulletin Highlights — 2023

January

A brief history of the Federal Milk Marketing Orders (FMMOs) adoption of a pricing system that incorporated the commodity price of cheese was given. The calculation of the protein price was explained. The 40-pound block and 500-pound barrel cheese spread were highlighted. Charts illustrated monthly block, barrel, and cheese prices from 2018 through 2022, and annual block versus barrel cheese sales from 2000 through 2022.

February

U.S. milk total production rose 0.1 percent in 2022; for comparison, growth in 2021 was an increase of 1.6 percent. Milk production, cow numbers, and production per cow were compared for the U.S. and Northeast milkshed for 2022 vs 2021. A table showed selected statistics for the top ten states ranked by 2022 milk production.

The Northeast Order's Statistical Uniform Price (SUP) dropped in the first two months of 2023 after record setting price points in 2022. A market update was given, discussing feed and diesel prices, and dairy exports. A chart showed feed prices, diesel, and SUP for January 2020 through December 2023 including projections for February through December 2023.

March

Changes in rankings and the proportion of farms and daily deliveries per producer (DDP) in the top ten Northeast Order counties in 2022 were discussed. A map depicted the top ten counties: their rank and percent change in pounds, farm numbers, and DDP from 2021 to 2022. A table showed milk production, number of farms, and average DDP in the top ten counties pooling on the Order for 2022.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–March, 2022 and 2023.

April

The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) released their *Dairy Products 2022 Summary*. Changes in national cheese production and other selected products, top manufacturing states, and percent of total milk production were discussed. A table highlighted selected products' changes from 2021 and 2017 to 2022, and a comparison of Northeast Order milk used in the

manufacture of these products.

Compositional reference points represent the pounds of protein, other solids, and nonfat solids per hundredweight (cwt) of skim milk that are specifically a portion of components in Class I, II, III, and IV skim milk prices. How compositional reference points are used in the calculation of skim prices was explained.

May

In the first half of 2023, month after month the Northeast Order's SUP has gradually declined. The SUP for May 2023 fell 11.0 percent to \$19.46 per cwt, from the beginning of the year, and a decrease of 26.8 percent when compared to May 2022. A market update was given, discussing feed and diesel prices, and dairy exports. A chart illustrated feed prices, diesel, and SUP for January 2020 through December 2023 including projections for June through December 2023. A table showed estimated prices using Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) futures for June through December 2023.

USDA announced they received a formal proposal on May 2, 2023, to amend the pricing provisions of all eleven FMMOs. The proposal requests to increase manufacturing (make) allowances, returning to the "higher of" as the mover for Class I milk prices, updating the milk composition factors, removing barrel cheese from the Class III price formula, and updating the Class I price surface.

June

Milk production in the U.S. for the first 6 months of 2023 was compared to the same period in 2022. A table showed the top ten states ranked by milk production and selected areas for 2022 vs 2023. A map illustrated the year-to-year percent change in milk production for the NASS 24 major states for January through June 2023. Northeast Order pool volume was discussed.

On July 21, 2023, USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) issued a notice of public hearing on proposed amendments to all FMMOs. The national hearing would be held to consider and take evidence on proposals to amend the pricing formulas in the 11 FMMOs and would convene on August 23, 2023, in Carmel, Indiana.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–June, 2022 and 2023.

Bulletin Highlights — 2023 (continued)

July

Northeast Marketing Area (NMA) sales of fluid packaged milk continue to decline. Trends of packaged fluid milk sales, sales by product, and per capita sales were discussed. A table displayed sales in the NMA from 2017 through 2022. A table compared total per capita sales in the NMA vs the U.S. from 2017 through 2022.

The PPD was \$4.46 per cwt in July 2023, setting a new record-high for the month, and was the fourth largest PPD value since the formation of the Order. An explanation of how the PPD is calculated was given. A chart displayed the component and PPD breakdown of the SUP at test comparing July 2023 to select months.

A reminder was given that the Northeast Order required shipping percentage would remain at 10 percent for the months of September, October, and November 2023, as stated in the June 2022 *Bulletin*.

August

A summary of the proposals of the USDA's national hearing on the Proposed Rulemaking to Amend all FMMOs was given. The proposals that look to amend milk composition, surveyed commodity products, Class III and IV formula factors, base Class I skim milk price, and Class I and II differentials were listed and described.

September

The SUP had averaged \$19.83 per cwt with an average PPD of \$2.70 per cwt for the months of January to September 2023. A market update was given, discussing feed and diesel prices, and dairy exports. A chart illustrated feed prices, diesel, and SUP for January 2020 through December 2024 including projections for October 2023 through December 2024. A table showed estimated prices using CME futures for October 2023 through March 2024.

An update on the USDA's national hearing on the Proposed Rulemaking to Amend all FMMOs was given. The hearing commenced on August 23, 2023, in Carmel, IN, and recessed on October 11, 2023. It was announced the national hearing would reconvene on November 27, 2023, at the same location.

Pool data for all federal orders was summarized in a table for January–September, 2022 and 2023.

October

The October 2023 PPD of \$4.36 per cwt was the second highest for the year, a new record high for the month of October, and the fifth largest PPD for the Northeast Order since formation of the Order. A discussion on the PPD was held. A chart compared Northeast Order component and PPD breakdown of SUP at test for October 2023 vs selected months.

The total volume of producer milk pooled from January through September 2023, on the Northeast Order was 1.5 percent higher than the same period in 2022. Changes in utilization for Class I, II, III, and IV, and the minimum price class were discussed. A table compared utilization percent changes of selected products for January through September from 2018, 2021, and 2022 to 2023.

An update on the USDA's national hearing on the Proposed Rulemaking to Amend all FMMOs was given. It was announced the national hearing will reconvene on November 27, 2023, at the same location. If the hearing is not completed by December 1, the hearing would reconvene in Zionsville, IN. The hearing commenced on August 23, 2023, in Carmel, IN, and recessed on October 11, 2023.

November

Cost, demand, and supply factors were analyzed for 2023 and predicted for 2024. A chart displayed the actual and estimated SUP compared to corn, soybean, and diesel prices for 2020 through projected 2024.

A schedule showed the 2024 dates for partial payments to producers who are not members of cooperatives. The Order requirement was explained.

December

Northeast Order's total milk received from producers in 2023 increased 1.4 percent from 2022. The annual average volume per producer continued to set record-highs jumping 836 pounds; it topped 10,000 pounds for two months during 2023, and over 9,000 pounds during all other months. Selected Northeast Order statistics for 2023 were summarized, and a table compared the Order's pool statistics for 2022 and 2023. A chart illustrated the class utilization of milk pooled on the Order for 2014 through 2023.
