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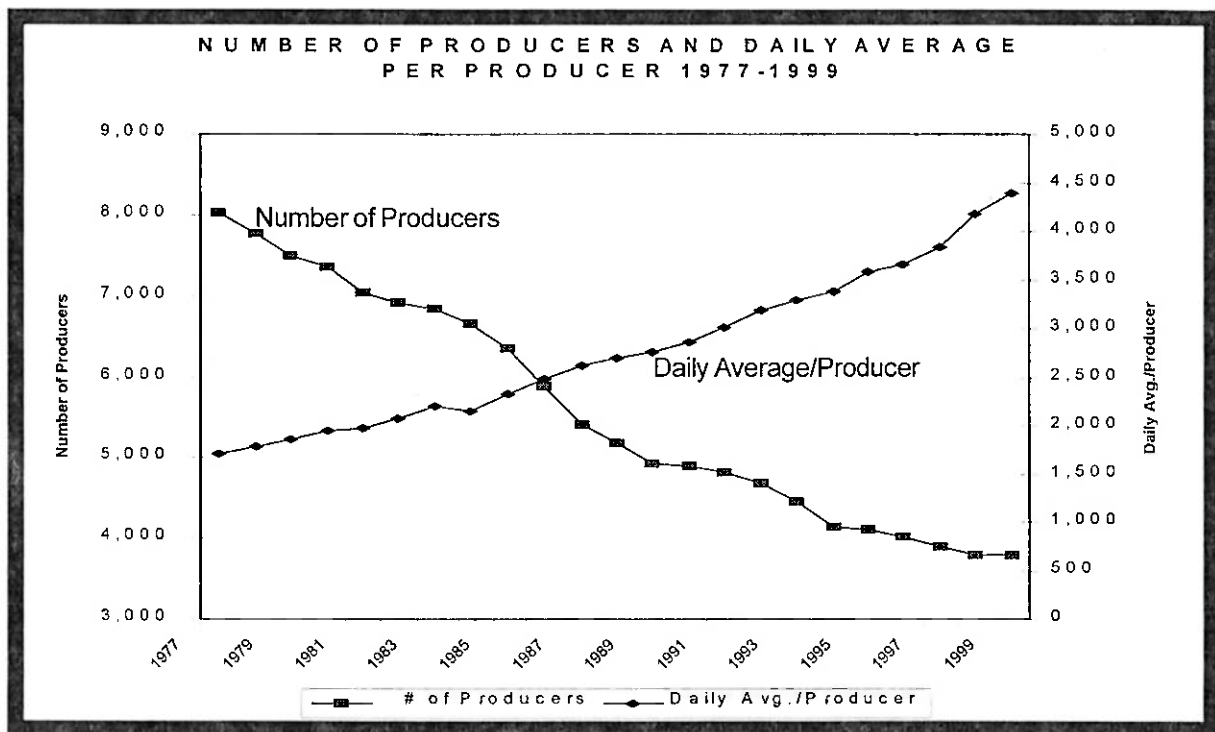

HAVE TIMES REALLY CHANGED?

The New England Marketing Area Comparison from 1977 to 1999

The New England Federal Order No. 1 was established on April 1, 1976, from the merger of the Boston Regional Federal Order and the Connecticut Federal Order. On January 1, 2000, the New England Federal Order merged with the Middle Atlantic and the New York-New Jersey Orders to form the new Northeast Federal Order. Major changes occurred in the New England market from its inception in April 1976 through December 31, 1999.

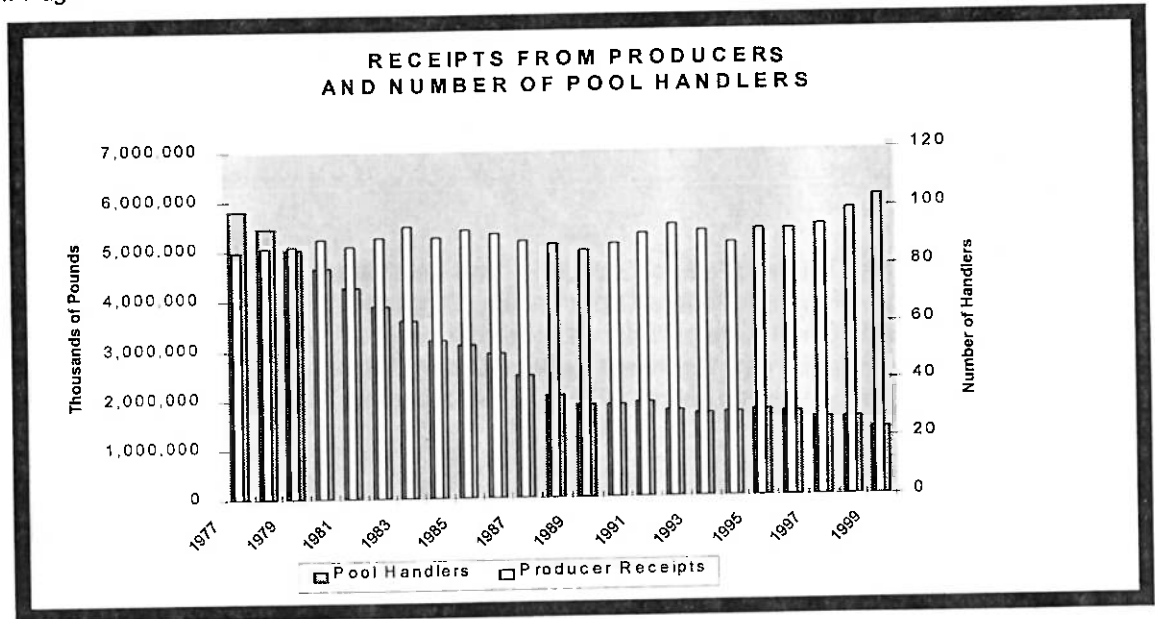


During 1977, the first full year of the New England Federal Order, 8,030 producers served the market. The number steadily decreased through 1999, when the average number of producers was 3,786, a decrease of 4,244 or 52.9 percent. In contrast, the average daily output per farm was 1,703 pounds in 1977 and 4,384 pounds during 1999, an increase of 2,684 pounds or 157.6 percent.

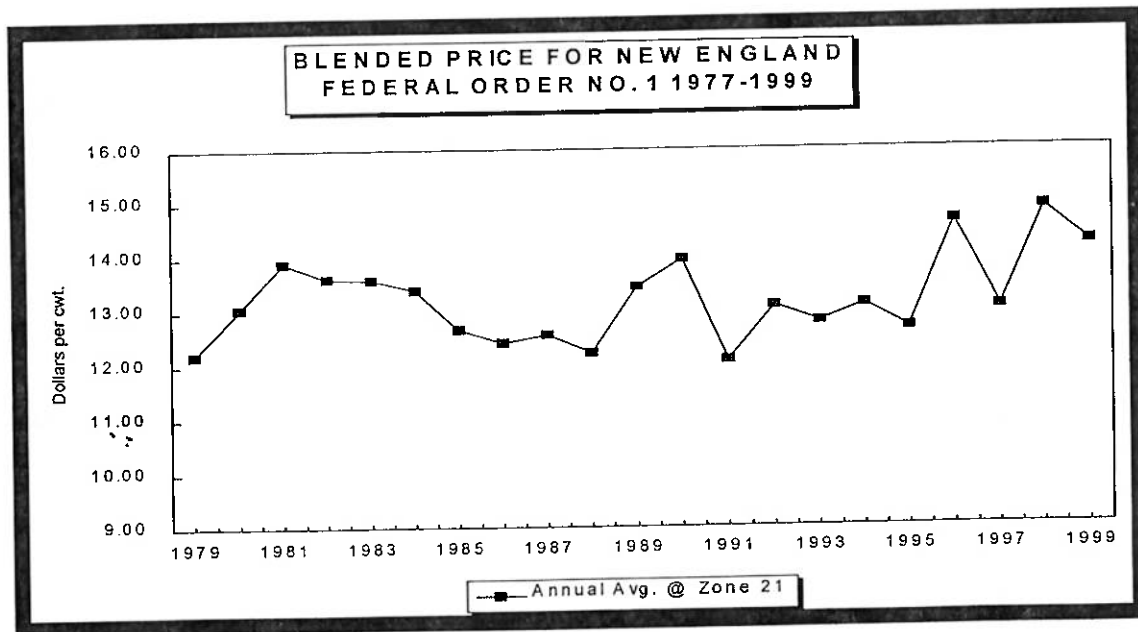

Yearly milk production increased from 4.99 billion pounds in 1977 to 6.06 billion pounds in 1999. The 1999 total was the result of a moderate but steady increase of 1.07 billion pounds or 21.4 percent. During the same period, the number of pool handlers decreased from 100 to 23, a decrease of 77 or 77 percent—the result of mergers which created fewer but larger handlers.



The average blended price for milk in Zone 21 was \$10.01 per hundredweight in 1977 and \$14.23 per hundredweight in 1999, showing a moderate increase of \$4.22 or 42.2 percent. However, in the 1990s, the month-to-month prices were more volatile than in previous years due to the price volatility of commodities, such as cheese, butter, and nonfat dried milk.
